# **IRA kills prison official** while family watches


BELFAST, Northern Ireland - Two IRA gunmen killed a Maze prison official Tuesday, firing repeatedly through the rear window of his car as the man's wife and child watched after kissing him goodbye on

nell, 35, as assistant governor at the prison, was shot in the head and face by the assassins from the outlawed Irish Republican Army. He slumped to the ground in a pool of blood and died nearly instantly.

McConnell had just kissed his wife, Beryl, and 3-year-old daughter, Gail, goodbye when the two gunmen ran up behind his car and fired repeatedly through the rear window.

As the gunmen escaped, the dying man's child was left screaming hysterically on the pavement as his wife cradled her husband in her lap, a neighbor said.

The IRA said McConnell, the 23rd prison officer to be killed in Northern Ireland, was exe-


