With 16 years in the major leagues, Houston pitcher Nolan Ryan has seen many a spring training come and go. But ex-hibition season 1984 is proving o be better than most

The right-hander, who was has pitched five no-hitters in his career, retired the first 19 Detroit Tigers Sunday. His streak ended when Alan Trammel was safe on an error in the seventh inning in the game at Lakeland,

Joe Sambito relieved Ryan in the eighth, with the Astros leading 1-0, and was tagged with the loss in Houston's 2-1 defeat.

Overshadowed by Ryan's perormance was the job by Jack Morris, who pitched the first seven innings for the Tigers. Morris allowed just two hits and the lone Houston run in the first inning

The score remained 1-0 until the bottom of the eighth when Lance Parrish greeted Sambito with a leadoff single. Parrish moved to third base when Sambito threw wildly to first on a pickoff play.

After Kirk Gibson was hit by a pitch, Glenn Wilson tied the score with a sharp single to left. Pinch hitter Barbaro Garbey was safe on another error to load the bases. John Wockenfuss then hit a sacrifice fly for the gamewinning RBI.

The Tigers improved their exhibition record to 5-9. Houston fell to 8-6.

In other exhibition games: At Bradenton, Fla., outfielder Ruppert Jones scored the tying run in the fifth inning and later drove in an insurance run to lead the Pittsburgh Pirates to a 6-4 deicsion over the St. Louis Cardinals. 
