The controversial tabloid distributes more than 30 million copies in California each year. Under the circumstances, Justice William Rehnquist wrote for the court, they must "reasonably anticipate being hauled into court there' to answer for the truth of the statements made in their article."

EPA controversy flaring once again

WASHINGTON — A House subcommittee chairman is challenging a decision by Justice Department officials who overturned a recommendation for a perjury indictment against the EPA's former general counsel, sources said Tuesday.

Former general counsel Robert Perry was among nearly a dozen ousted Environmental Protection Agency officials cleared of criminal allegations by the Justice Department last year after lengthy FBI investigations stemming from a controversy that shook the agency.

In a report that cleared several of the EPA officials last August, the Justice Department said Perry gave "inconsistent" sworn testimony to Congress, but concluded there was insufficient evidence of willful deception to warrant a perjury pros-

Only Rita Lavelle, who headed EPA's hazardous waste cleanup unit, was prosecuted as a result of the scandal, prompting some House Democrats to accuse the Justice Department of a political whitewash.

Lavelle's firing in February 1983 triggered a stream of alle-gations that Reagan administration officials at the agency had cozy ties with industry, conflicts of interest and cut sweetheart deals with companies they were regulating. The revelations resulted in Anne Burford's resignation as EPA chief and the departure of 21 other political

Rep. John Dingell, D-Mich., chairman of the House Energy and Commerce subcommittee on oversight and investigation, challenged the department's handling of the Perry case in a March 7 letter to Associate At-

In the letter, first disclosed by The Washington Post, Dingel wrote that "a recommendation at the prosecutorial level to seek an indictment of Mr. Perry on certain matters under investig tion was rejected by higher department officials.

A knowledgeable Justice Department source said that the decision not to seek an indidment of Perry was made by career department attorneys, not political appointees.

One source said prosecutors in the Justice Department's Public Integrity Section urged seeking an indictment against

A Justice Department source said the lawyers were over turned by a five-member review committee, including senior lawyers in the unit, who decided unanimously not to seek an in dictment. The decision neve reached the political level, the source asserted.

Dingell asked to see the de partment's records on the case including a memo from the d partment's Office of Leg Counsel, headed by Theo Olson, that he described "critical of the decision not proceed against Mr. Perry.

Department sources said memo was written by La Sims, who was out of town a unavailable for comment.

The department had investigated two possibly fall statements by Perry during sworn testimony to Congress December 1982 and on Mar 7, 1983.
