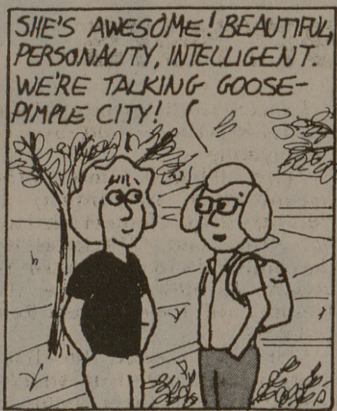
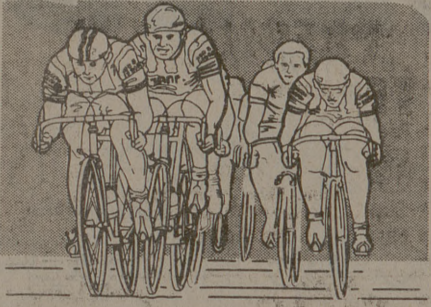

Caucus endorses women

 AUSTIN — The Texas Women's Political Caucus announced Wednesday the candidates it is endorsing in the May

5 primary, but focused its attention on four women seeking seats in the Legislature.

Meg Wilson of Austin, chairman of the state caucus, said the group would make a special effort to support four women newcomers running for seats in the Texas House:

Marilyn Mieszkuc, Houston, District 130; Kris Wolody, Houston, District 131; Nancy McDonald, El Paso, District 73; and Lena Guerrero, Austin, District 51.

"These women will receive not only our endorsement —

they get our money and our time," said Wilson. "Currently Texas is 43rd in the nation in the number of women in our Legislature — a dismal level for a state that is striving to be No. 1 in almost everything else."

During the last session, only 13 of the 150 House members were women and no women

among the 31 members of the Texas Senate.

Wilson was joined at a conference by Kathy Wilson, chairman of the National Women's Political Caucus.

"Women legislators tend to be more responsive to the needs of women constituents," Kathy Wilson.

City hall into street after refusing rent

ARCOLA — There is no resolution in sight in a rent payment dispute that has driven the city government of this community out into the streets. "City Council started meeting on the tops of city parking lots, and they're where they started," City Attorney Steve Gilbert says.

Buster Tripp, the owner of the City Hall — merely a beer hall — says he owes him \$1,914.24 in rent.

City officials claim \$400,000 in renovations were made in of rent through 1983. Tripp argues the city never produced receipts for the renovations.

The officials, convinced owner was serious about putting locks on the City Hall, moved all the records to the mayor's home late last week.

The Council now is meeting in a church cafeteria while police are operating out of patrol cars.
