Beer sale request faces opposition

AUSTIN — Alamo Stadium-area residents told a state hearing examiner Wednesday the San Antonio Gunslingers should be barred from selling beer at home games because it will generate rowdy crowds and contribute to traffic problems.

Joe Garza, an examiner for the state Alcoholic Beverage Commission, said he would issue a preliminary recommendation next week.

The United States Football League team's request to sell beer first drew opposition from

stadium-area residents and some school district trustees who claimed it would violate the law.

The stadium is owned by the school district, but is leased to the Gunslingers.

"The impact on the neighborhood of that many people drinking beer and exiting after a function will be on the safety of the area," said Ricardo Cedillo, a lawyer for the residents.

Mike Maloney, a lawyer for the South Texas Sports Association, said he was confident the sale of beer is not prohibited.

Grain to be protected

WASHINGTON — Farmers seeking protection for grain tied up in bankrupt elevators won a "long hard victory" with House passage Wednesday of the Bankruptcy Court Reorganization Bill, supporters said.

"I'm elated that the grain elevator provisions were included in this comprehensive bankruptcy package," said Rep. Bill Emerson, R-Mo. "I've been fighting for three solid years to have the bankruptcy statutes amended to clarify the status for farmers who have grain in elevators that go bankrupt."

Farmstate members of Congress have been working since 1981 to help resolve problems dramatically thrust into the public eye with the arrest of Puxico, Mo., farmer Wayne Cryts for refusing to tell an Arkansas bankruptcy

judge who helped remove Cryt's soybeans from a bankrupt elevator.

Currently, there are no standards to determine who owns grain when an elevator goes bankrupt.

The House, on a voice vote, Wednesday approved a bankruptcy bill that includes "good grain elevator bankruptcy provisions."

"I feel like we've won a long hard victory," said Rep. Dan Glickman, D-Kan. "I've been pulling a lot of teeth of staff and members of the Judiciary Committee but they all agreed to put this in the bill, largely because the merits were on our side."

Since the Senate already has passed similar elevator bankruptcy protections "six times," according to Emerson, they are expected to survive when House and Senate negotiators sit down to iron

out differences in their bankruptcy system bills.

Sen. Bob Dole, R-Kan., repeatedly criticized a chairman of the House Judiciary Committee for not moving more quickly on bankruptcy reform to protect nation's farmers.

Congress is under pressure to act quickly. If nothing done by March 31 the federal bankruptcy system will lapse. The Supreme Court declared the system unconstitutional two years ago, since then the system has continued to function under interim rule approved by U.S. Judicial Conference.

Under the bill: —Farmers will get a priority in collecting assets from bankrupt warehouses. Currently, the farmer is at the bottom of the priority list and in most cases loses all, or most of, the crop's value;
