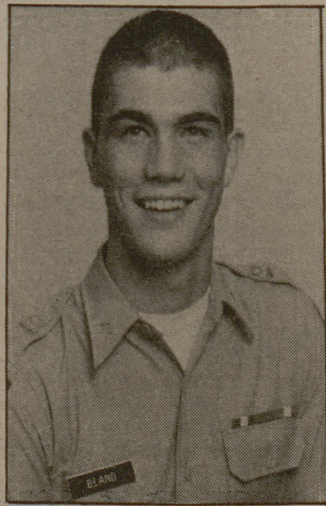

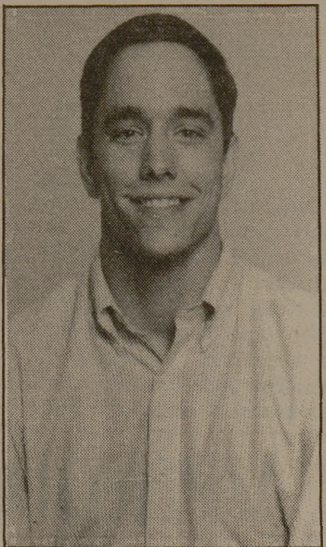
I am actively involved in MSC Hospitality and with sophomore class committee.

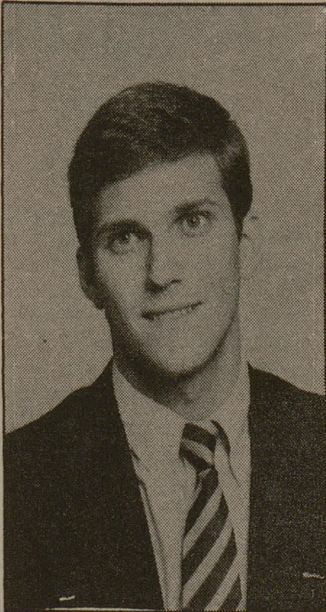
To be elected yell leader would be a dream come true
