Spring fashions stress silhouettes

NEW YORK — Women's fashions for spring are designed to make milady look taller and thinner.
With few exceptions, there is nothing to interrupt the long, lean silhouette most major designers have offered for the spring and summer season.
The influential Calvin Klein summed up his collection by saying, "This is the purest collection I have done to date." Klein could have been speaking for most major U.S. manufacturers who showed longer skirts for daytime, sometimes with hemlines almost to the ankles, and in most instances, a pared-down silhouette.
The customer can take her choice of whether to belt or not. Yves St. Laurent of Paris revived the fashion world has followed the designer, whom some experts label the premier one in the world today.
Spring's chemise comes with a difference, however. Designers have given it a wider look in the shoulders, through subtle cut and seam of fabric.
You won't find every designer endorsing longer hemlines. Showing some of the shortest, even for some evening clothes, was Halston who simply revived the miniskirt length.
For daytime, there is a strong influence of sportswear looks. So plan on a lot of sweater dressing, even as warmer weather arrives. Sweatered tops are paired with fabric skirts, using such as linen, silk or cotton.
Pattern is everywhere, in bold plaids, stripes both vertical and horizontal, and a mix of patterns once considered unthinkable, such as pairing big plaids with tiny checks, or floral prints with horizontal stripes.

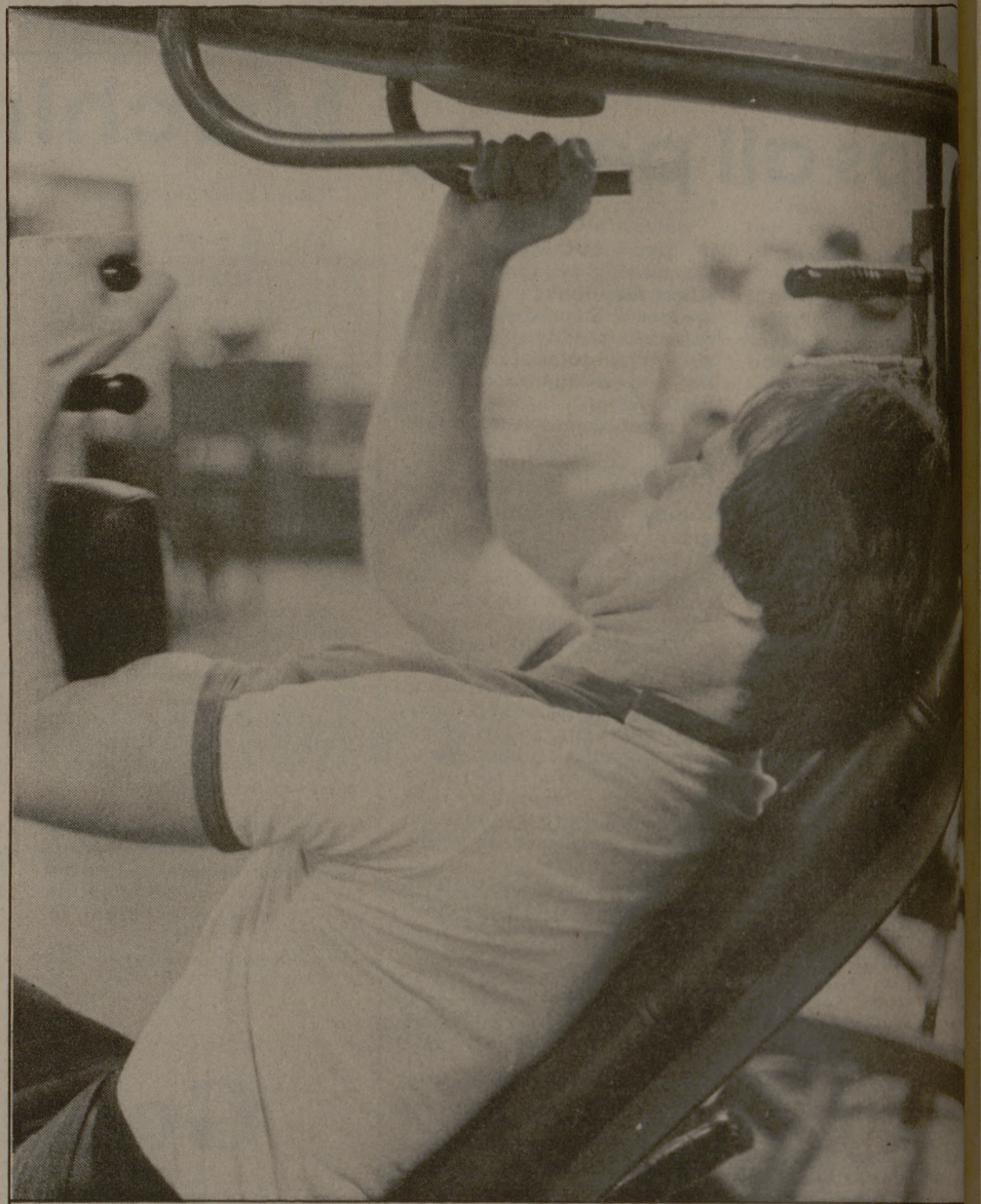
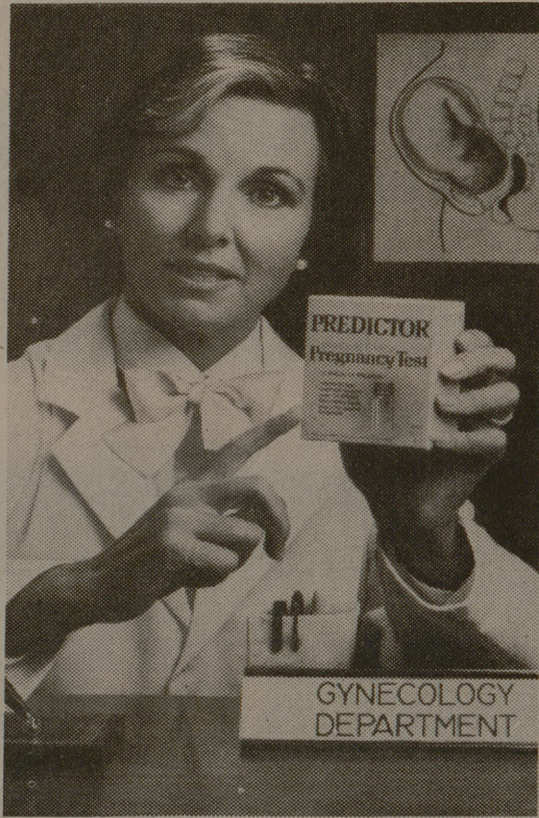

rooms. Wertz is a senior petroleum engineering major from Arlington Heights, Illinois.

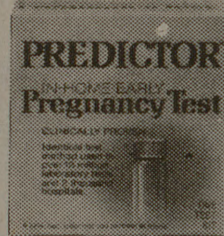

Communications field growing

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Telecommunication leaders say in two years the use of briefcases, purses and watches to make phone calls home or to the office no longer will be the creation of Dick Tracy cartoons and James Bond movies.
"There's a drastic need for good communication," says Armand Paquette of Geneva-based NovAtel Communications Inc., in reference to an impending cellular radio-telephone concept.

"Eventually, everybody will be carrying mobile phones either by hand or in their pants." The Jan. 1 divestiture of Bell System and American Telephone and Telegraph Co. will allow the Bell companies to purchase supplies from companies other than Western Electric. AT&T subsidiary, representing a potential of nearly \$13 billion of new business this year for phone suppliers.
Reflecting the beginning of a new era, all of the telephone companies formerly part of the Bell System have joined the United States Telephone Association (USTA), which was organized in 1897 to act on behalf of the smaller independent telephone companies.
