

# Election results

Class of '85 vice president approved after question of credit hours regulation settled

Carla Proctor was pronounced class of '85 vice president Thursday evening after the Judicial Board decided she was an eligible candidate for the office. Proctor's eligibility was questioned when the Board became uncertain whether she had enough hours to run for the office.

A statement from the Board said a lack of clarity in the regulations led to Proctor's initial disqualification. The Board ruled in favor of Proctor after deciding that the intent of the regulations was not to exclude people in "unusual circumstances" from running for class offices, the statement said.

"We reviewed the intent of the rule and decided to go with intent rather than tradition," Judicial Board chairman Tracey Quigley said.

Proctor won the election by a clear margin, having 767 of about 900 votes, Quigley said.

All seven of the proposed changes to the constitution were approved and referendum 1(b), which will increase the student center complex fee by \$10 to \$20 over a three year period also was approved.




