## Runaway called arsonist

BELLAIRE - A 16-year-old runaway told police he started church fires and committed burglaries because he felt rejected, officials said Thursday.

Bellaire police stopped the youth as he ran from Synogo-gue B'rith Shalom carrying money and trinkets. The temple is next to the Faith American Lutheran Church, which was set on fire and bur-glarized March 13. Police said the youth admitted the acts.

Officials said the youth, who left a runway center six weeks ago, is being questioned about at least eight other burglaries of religious institutions.

Bellaire investigator Mary Smith said the youth said he attended most of the churches seeking help and fellowship, but said he told her he felt rejected and set the churches on

He is also being questioned about a series of church arsons and burglaries in Houston, officials said.

## **Two jailed** in death of child

CONROE - A judge set bond at \$20,000 each Thursday for two people who owned a pit bulldog which bit a 4-year-old boy to death last month.

Montgomery County dep-uties arrested Jerri Miller, 26, of Plantersville, and her live-in boyfriend, James Traxler, 28, Wednesday night and charged them with serious injury to a child.

Miller's son James Dwayne Miller was bitten to death by the pit bulldog on Feb. 23 when he was left alone outside by his babysitter and wandered close to the chained animal, officials said.

The case is pending before a Montgomery County grand jury, which heard testimony Wednesday

Authorities said Miller and Traxler were aware the animal was vicious.

Howard DuPree, spokesman for the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department, said two grown pit bulldogs were found chained to the front and back doors of the house and two younger pit bulldogs were run-ning loose inside the house when authorities served arrest warrants on the couple.
