

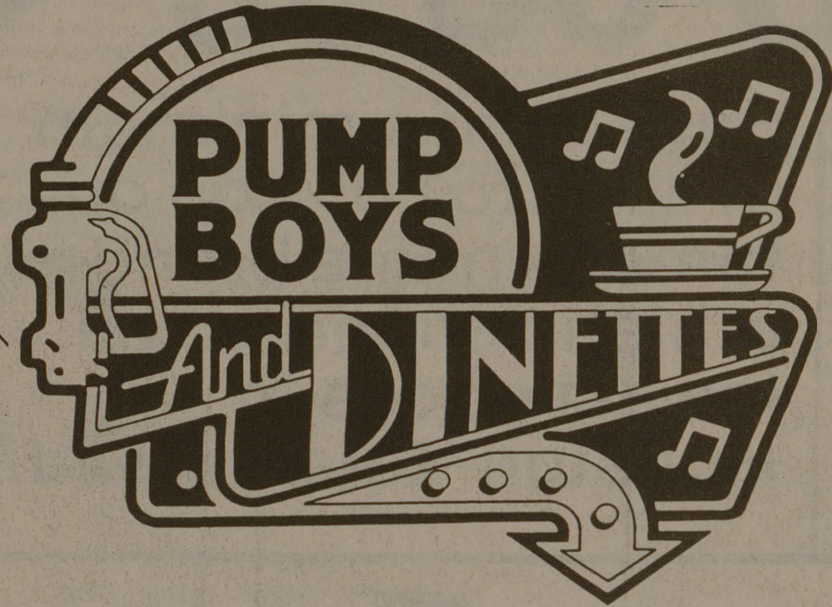
# White's top assistant to manage Walter Mondale's Texas campaign

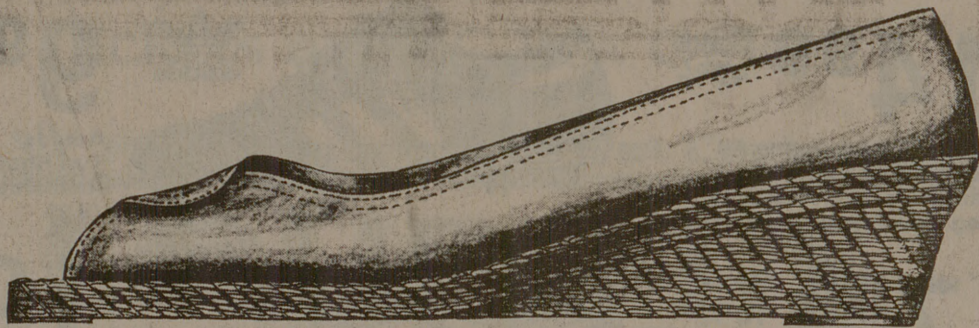

## FBI searching for suspect in kidnappings, murders

 MIAMI — Christopher B. Wilder, a wealthy Australian wanted for the sexual abduction of a Florida State University student March 20, has been tracked to the Las Vegas area, the FBI reported Tuesday night. The bearded, balding 39-year-old Wilder is now a suspect in the disappearances of seven young, attractive women in Florida, Texas, Colorado and Nevada, said Joseph Corless, special agent in charge of the Miami FBI. "Our search is intensifying in the West coast," Corless told a news conference. "We have a

tracking of him going west. There seems to be a progressive move westward."

He said a man answering Wilder's description was observed at a shopping mall where Michelle Korfman, 17, disappeared April 1.

Following the kidnapping in Tallahassee of the FSU co-ed, who later escaped from a Bainbridge, Ga., motel, Wilder was charged with violation of the federal kidnapping law and quickly linked to the disappearance of two aspiring young models in Miami.

He was seen in the company of Rosario Gonzalez who disappeared during the Feb. 25 Miami Grand Prix in which he raced. He also was known to Elizabeth Kenyon, a part-time Miami model, seen with her just before her disappearance March 3.

Corless said Wilder was wanted for questioning about the disappearances and names of two young women whose bodies have been found. Fergusson was believed kidnapped from Merritt Island on March 18 and Terry Wain from Beaumont on March 20.

## Shuttle preparing for repair mission

 CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — Launch preparations for the shuttle Challenger's novel satellite-repair mission ticked along like clockwork Tuesday with the orbiter's 43-hour countdown ready to begin early Wednesday morning.

Commander Robert Crippen, co-pilot Dick Scobee and crewmen Terry Hart, James "Ox" van Hoften and George "Pinky" Nelson planned to arrive at Kennedy Space Center from Houston aboard their blue and white jets about 5 p.m. EST. Challenger and its five-man crew are scheduled to blast off Friday at 8:58 a.m. EST for a bold six-day mission to repair

the crippled Solar Max satellite. A sun-watching observatory broke down nine months ago and was launched on Valentine's Day 1980.

"Most of the tasks have essentially been completed," NASA spokesman Jim McHugh said. "We don't have any significant trouble-shooting jobs to do. This is the way we like it."

The countdown was scheduled to begin at 3 a.m. Wednesday at the wind-swept complex and steel launch pad.

NASA officials said preparations for Friday's blastoff should run smoother than for any previous shuttle flight, though seven days off the old schedule for getting a shuttle ready for re-launch between missions.

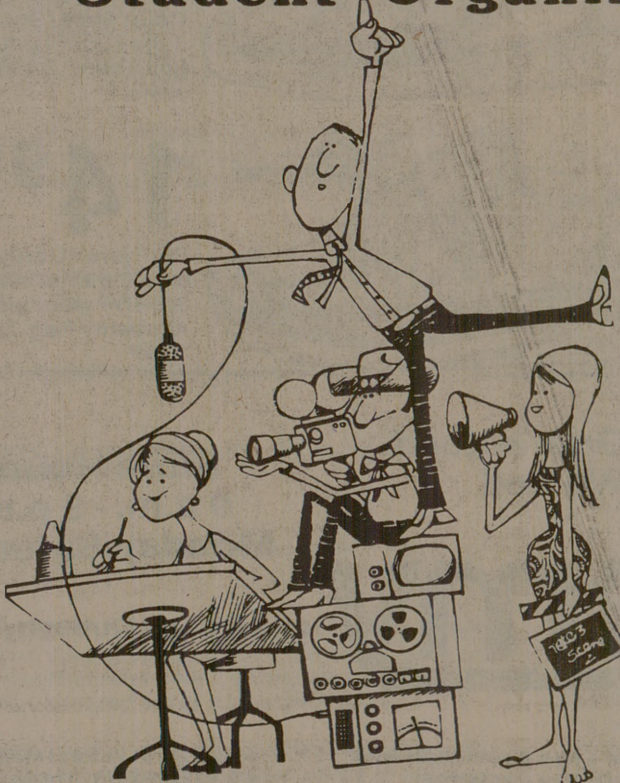
