# Kidnapping suspect might be in the state

WASHINGTON — The FBI Thursday placed Christopher Wilder, a photographer who allegedly lures his victims with promises of modeling jobs, on its list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" for allegedly kidnapping as many as seven women.

At an unusual news conference to announce the action, FBI Official Oliver Revell described Wilder as "a continuing active menace" who is believed to be heading west. The FBI said his abandoned 1973 Chrysler was discovered Thursday in Winnie.

Wilder, 39, an Australian-born photographer whose identity has been known for less than a month, was described by an FBI spokesman as "a badly wanted fugitive."

He is wanted for the kidnapping of a Tallahassee, Fla., woman who was abducted on

March 20 from a shopping mall, and raped and tortured. The woman managed to escape in Bainbridge, Ga., and provided authorities with their first description of Wilder.

Revell said Wilder also is a suspect in the disappearances of six other women.

"We have reason to believe he is extremely active, and very dangerous," Revell said.

Revell said Wilder is known to randomly approach young women in shopping malls and business areas, and to try to persuade them to accompany him for photo sessions.

If Wilder is responsible for the other six disappearances, Revell said, it would be a "classic case of serial murders, sexually motivated." The FBI has been focusing on serial murderers, those who travel from city to city selecting their victims based on common characteristics.

Wilder is a suspect in the disappearance of Michele Korfman, who was last seen at a shopping mall Sunday in Las Vegas.

The mustachioed amateur photographer failed to appear in court in Manly, Australia, Tuesday to face charges in the kidnap-assault of two girls, 12.

The first abduction of which Wilder is suspected occurred Feb. 26 in Miami, Fla., when Rosario Gonzalez was kidnapped. She has not been seen since.

On March 23, Terry Diane Walden was abducted at Beaumont. Her body was found in an irrigation ditch.

Last Thursday, Sheryl Lynn Bonaventura was kidnapped from a shopping mall in Grand Junction, Colo. She has not been found.

# Texas embezzlers to be sentenced

FORT WORTH — The owner and two regional managers of a chain of spare parts stores will be sentenced in federal court May 18 for overcharging nine Air Force bases over a 10-year period.

Robert R. Westbrook, 60, of suburban Grand Prairie, owner of One Stop Motor Parts Inc., was convicted after a 25-day trial of 18 counts of mail fraud and conspiracy to defraud the government.

Two regional managers for his company — Burton Purdy of San Antonio and Manuel J. Eres of Green Acres, Wash. — were convicted of eight counts each.

U.S. District Judge Eldon Mahon set sentencing. Westbrook faces up to 90 years in prison and fines totalling \$27,000. Eres and Purdy each could get up to 40 years in prison and \$17,000 in fines.
