Klan's protest costly

AUSTIN — The cost to taxpayers for providing extra law enforcement protection for the 35 Ku Klux Klan members who marched briefly in Austin over the weekend will exceed \$175,000, officials said Sunday.

There were no arrests and no injuries in the march and rally Saturday at the state Capitol, which lasted less than 40 minutes.

The exact cost of overtime and equipment costs for riot-equipped lawmen has not been determined, but police Chief Frank Dyson said the cost to city taxpayers will be higher than the \$70,000 the 1983 march cost.

Larry Todd, spokesman for the state Department of Public Safety, said state costs were estimated at more than \$107,000.

About 290 Austin police officers and 325 state troopers kept a close watch on the Klan and the 700 anti-Klan demonstrators.

The march Saturday was in sharp contrast to one in Austin on Feb. 19, 1983 when 11 people were injured and 13 arrested in a rock-throwing melee.

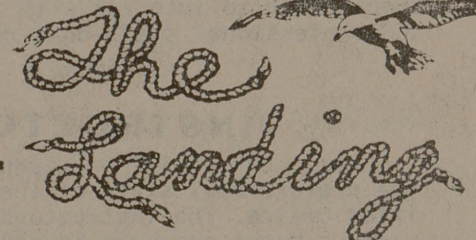

3 boys suffocated in icebox

CHAPARRAL, N.M. — Officials tried to revive three boys found in an abandoned refrigerator in this town near New Mexico-Texas border. The children were pronounced dead at an El Paso hospital, police said Sunday.

The victims were identified as Daniel Cruz, 5, Raul Cruz and Mark A. Cruz, 3. Officials said Raul and Mark lived at home and Daniel lived at a nearby house.

The boys were found in a refrigerator Saturday afternoon, authorities said. They were given cardiopulmonary resuscitation and rushed to William Beaumont Hospital, where they were pronounced dead from suffocation or cardiac arrest.
