## Mavericks get first playoff win

DALLAS — Rolando Blackman rebounded his own missed shot and scored with 11 seconds remaining Tuesday night to climax a Dallas comeback and bring the Mavericks their first playoff victory ever, an 88-86 decision over the Seattle SuperSonics.

Dallas overcame a 15-point, first-quarter deficit and an astounding first-half show by Seattle's Gus Williams to take a 1-0 lead in the best-of-five series.

Williams scored 23 points in the first quarter and 31 in the first half to spark the Sonics to a quick advantage over the stunned Mavericks. Williams eventually finished with 37.

But Dallas slowly climbed back into the game, jumped in

front three minutes deep in the final quarter and surged to a five-point lead.

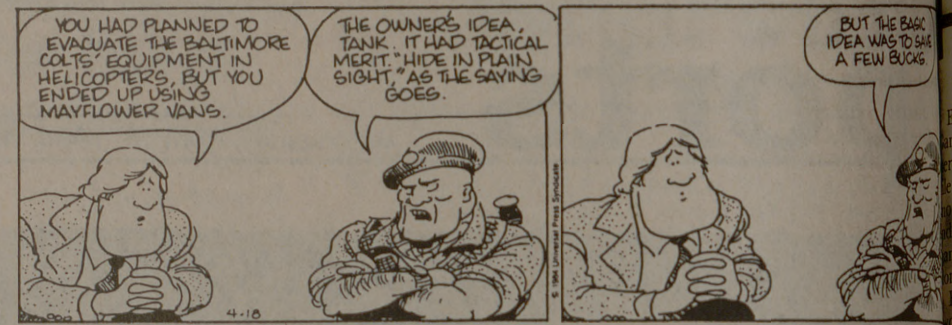
Seattle, however, ran off eight straight points to take an 86-83 advantage with 2:30. Despite the Sonics' overwhelming edge in playoff experience, they lost their composure down the stretch and did not score another point.

After Blackman's pivotal shot and rebound over Sikma, the Seattle center had a chance to put his team back in front, but he threw up a wild shot on a drive to the basket that rattled off the rim.

Dallas was forced to play the final two minutes without star Mark Aguirre, who fouled out with 20 points. Brad Davis and Vincent each had 16.

## Williams denies story

HOUSTON — Denver Nuggets guard Rob Williams said he was misquoted last week in a story in which he said he received up to \$600 a game from an attorney-agent while playing in college at the University of Houston.

Williams was quoted last week in the Rocky Mountain News saying former UH player Jerry R. Bonney, a lawyer and agent, gave \$500-\$600 a game to Williams, Clyde Drexler and Larry Micheaux during the 1980-81 season when the Cougars advanced to the Final Four of the NCAA playoffs.

"He didn't really give us loans, he just gave us money," Williams was quoted in the News. "All he wanted was to have something to do with representing us."

However, Williams said Monday he was misquoted or misunderstood, possibly because he was rushing from the locker room after a game in Houston.

"After the game I was trying to hurry and get out of (The Summit)," he said. "I was talking so fast I guess the guy misunderstood me. I said the money was propositioned but no one took it."

Contacted today, officials at the News stood by their story.

Both Drexler and Micheaux Monday denied they had ever been given money by Bonney.

"I would never have left col-

lege if I could have had any kind of money in school," Drexler, now a member of the Portland Trailblazers, said. "I know what Rob's money was, but Larry and I he gets this mess cleared up. Bonney also denied money to any UH players they were still in school."

"I've never done anything consistent with the University of Houston," he said.

However, he maintained he did loan Williams some money to help pay for his senior year to enter the draft and filed suit last week to collect that money.

Williams declined comment on the suit.

Dale Smith, a member of the NCAA enforcement committee, said that he neither could nor would deny there was an inquiry into Williams' contract charges.

If Williams had been given money from Bonney as a player, Houston could have possible probation in the ball program.

## Knight: Defense, shooting are keys

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. — U.S. Olympic Basketball Coach Bobby Knight said Tuesday he hopes to mold a winning team from players who can shoot and play defense as well as show endurance and team spirit.

Knight opened tryouts and 3-a-day workouts for the 1984 national team, then held an afternoon news conference to discuss his goals for the team.

"I think shooting is an important priority because I believe we will be playing against a number of zones," Knight said. "Most international teams — practically all of the good ones — will probably play more zone than they will man-to-man."

Knight, a two-time NCAA champion coach at Indiana University, said he believes the

Soviet Union definitely will participate in the summer of games in Los Angeles.

"I think if the Soviet come, but you can bet your bottom dollar the Russians going to be there," he said. "The Russians are not going to pass up that opportunity. There's no way."

Seventy-two players at IU Tuesday to try out for the team. Six players were invited to make the trip. That includes Kentucky's "Two Bows," Melvin Turpin and Bowie, as well as Keith Memphis State.

Knight said no player anteed a spot on the team.
