NEW YORK — The secretarial route to management is becoming more common, but being a secretary can be a re-warding career in itself — if it's approached in the right way, the author of a book for secre-

taries says.

"A good secretary has an extraordinary range of skills but she often doesn't know how to capitalize on them and translate them to higher pay and a more interesting job," Jodie Berlin Morrow said. She has translated
