Houston area population up

WASHINGTON — The Houston metropolitan area grew 11.5 percent between 1980 and 1982, edging Washington and its suburbs out of eighth place in the national population rankings, the Census Bureau said Wednesday.

The bureau, in a report showing population changes in major metropolitan areas over the two-year period, also said Atlanta surpassed Baltimore for 15th place and the Tampa-St. Petersburg area knocked Cincinnati out of the 20th spot.

"There are now 36 metropolitan areas with populations of at least 1 million, including the Charlotte, N.C., area, which has Charlotte, N.C., area, which has passed that mark since 1980," the bureau said. "The Salt Lake City-Odgen, Utah, area probably will exceed 1 million when estimates for 1983 are comstimates for 1983 are comstrained."
