## Houston area population up

WASHINGTON — The Houston metropolitan area grew 11.5 percent between 1980 and 1982, edging Washington and its suburbs out of eighth place in the national population rankings, the Census Bureau said Wednesday.

The bureau, in a report showing population changes in major metropolitan areas over the two-year period, also said Atlanta surpassed Baltimore for 15th place and the Tampa-St. Petersburg area knocked Cincinnati out of the 20th spot.

"There are now 36 metropolitan areas with populations of at least 1 million, including the Charlotte, N.C., area, which has passed that mark since 1980," the bureau said. "The Salt Lake City-Ogden, Utah, area probably will exceed 1 million when estimates for 1983 are completed this summer."

Nearly half the nation's population lives in the 1-million-plus metropolitan areas, the bureau said — on 5 percent of the nation's land.

Metropolitan areas overall grew faster in the first two years of this decade than they did in the 1970s, when they lagged behind the national growth rate, the bureau said.

Don Starsinic, an author of the report, said it is too soon to tell whether there is a real resurgence of the cities or whether the recession forced people to stay in areas they otherwise might have left.

"The recession could be responsible, in that it cuts down on movement and economic opportunities," he said. "There are fewer jobs available. People tend to stay put rather than they would during economic expansion."

Aside from the Washington switch, there were no changes in the ranks of the top 10 metropolitan areas between 1980 and 1982. New York remained No. 1 with 11.9 million people, Los Angeles cago third at 8 million. Philadelphia is fourth with 5.7 million, San Francisco at 5.5 million, Detroit at 4.6 million and Boston at 4 million.

Houston moved into 11th place with 3.45 million. Washington fell to ninth with 3.33 million. Dallas remained 10th with 3.1 million.

"All of the fast-growing metropolitan areas in the country were in the South or West," the bureau said. "The fastest growers were metropolitan Houston with a 11.5 percent growth rate, followed by Dallas-Forth Worth, 7.3 percent, Tampa-St. Petersburg, 6.3 percent, and Denver, 6.3 percent."

The bureau said growth in the North lagged, but somewhat better than it has been in the '70s. New York, Philadelphia and Milwaukee lost population in the decade but gained slightly between 1980 and '82.

Washington grew faster than any other northern city, at 7.3 percent, and Minneapolis second at 2.6 percent.

The bureau noted that metropolitan rankings often substantially from city to city because some cities annexed their suburbs while others did not.
