

Opening of Kennedy file to be ruled on by judge

PALM BEACH, Fla. — Laboratory tests that may reveal the cause of David Kennedy's death will be turned over to a judge today who will rule whether they will be made public.

Palm Beach County Circuit Judge R. William Rutter, who sealed all Kennedy investigation records Friday, has scheduled a hearing for 4 p.m. today to determine whether the news blackout should end.

Initial lab tests showed "significant amounts" of cocaine and the painkiller Demerol in the body of Kennedy, 28, son of the late Sen. Robert Kennedy. Police also found 1.3 grams of "high-purity" cocaine in the exclusive Brazilian Court Hotel, where Kennedy's body was discovered April 25.

An autopsy did not reveal the cause of death, and blood and tissue samples were turned over to the Palm Beach County sheriff's crime lab for analysis.

Neither crime lab toxicologists nor the medical examiner would comment on the tests, but one of Rutter's assistants said the results would be given to the judge.

Last week, police Capt. Richard Woods said they were seeking the source of the cocaine.

If the drug caused Kennedy's death, the person who provided it can be charged with murder under Florida law.

Services set today for singer 'Z.Z.' Hill

DALLAS — Funeral services will be held today for blues singer Arzell "Z.Z." Hill Sr., whose straightforward soul-blues style brought him a resurgence of popularity in the last three years.

Hill died Friday in a hospital of a heart attack. He was 48.

Funeral services are today in Hughes Springs, with burial at a cemetery in Naples.

In the last three years, since signing with Malaco Records of Jackson, Miss., Hill had come to national promi-

nence in blues circles. Billboard magazine recently called him a "master of the genre" of straightforward soul-blues singing.

His most recent album, "Down Home," became one of the biggest-selling blues albums in history, and Hill had a popular hit with the single "Down Home Blues."

Hill credited his success to a return to his early blues and 1960s soul roots.

"When disco came through it wiped the blues right off the map," he recently told the Dallas Morning News. "All the bands, even the local

bands, had to go with disco. Everybody wanted to hear it. It knocked a lot of people out."

"It almost knocked me out. I was just hanging on by a thread. Then we decided that, hey, maybe there still is an audience for that deep, deep soul music. That pure rhythm and blues sound. It worked."

But Hill, who took on the Z.Z. nickname on the inspiration of B.B. (Blues Boy) King, regretted that he never found real fame in Dallas, his home for most of his life.

Grannies sentence are upheld

AUSTIN — The 7th Circuit Court Monday upheld the jailing of two drug-possessing women who refused a judge where a judge stashed \$45,000 in cash.

Evelyn Herzog and Pauline Lindsay, both grandmothers, were jailed last month when they told County Court at Lloyd Perkins when they were arrested by Sheriff Bader of Sherman County the \$45,000.

St. Bernard Parish officials said they were released Tuesday on \$1,500 bond each. Jewelry was stolen in the burglary. The thief or thieves were not caught.

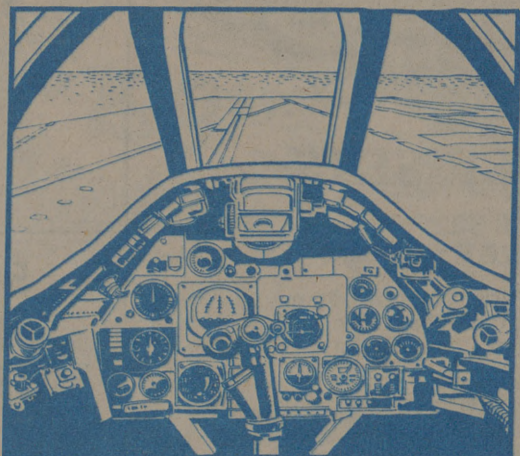
