Boudin gets 20 years to life

WHITE PLAINS, N.Y. -Repentant radical Kathy Boudin was sentenced Thursday to 20 years to life in prison for her role in the 1981 Brink's armored car robbery that left an armed guard and two policemen dead.

The former Weather Under-gound leader received the sentence for pleading guilty to sec-ond-degree murder and was given a concurrent 12¹/₂-to-25 year term for robbery. She will be eligible for parole in 17 years, when she will be 58.


Before her guilty plea she faced 75 years to life on 13 counts.

"I want to express my sorrow for the deaths of Sgt. Edward O'Grady and patrolman Waverly Brown directly to the family members who are here today and continue to grieve their loss," said Boudin.


