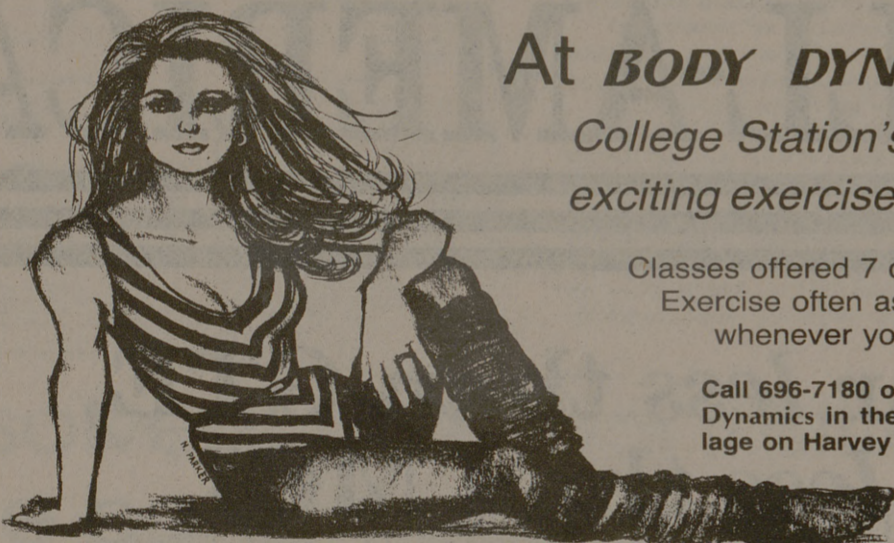

Lawyer recommends electric rate rollback

AUSTIN — The lawyer who represents Texas consumers in utility rate cases Tuesday recommended an \$81.8 million rollback in rates for the state's largest electric company, Texas Utilities Electric Co.
Jim Boyle, consumer counsel in cases before the Public Utility Commission, said his proposed reduction in rates for TUEC sharply contrasted with the company's recent request for a \$304 million rate increase.
"The Texas Utilities system has a history of receiving favorable treatment from Texas regulators, and the results of our analysis show that the company's current rates are excessive," Boyle said.
He said his staff economist had researched TUEC — which was formed last year in a merger of Texas Power & Light, Texas Electric Service and Dallas Power & Light — and found the company earned excess profits since 1973.
For the first nine months of fiscal 1984, Boyle said, the company had a 16.24 percent return compared to PUC-authorized returns of only 15.1 percent.

TUEC, which is constructing the Comanche Peak nuclear power plant near Glen Rose, has requested \$300 million in new rates.
