Former football pro honored

21 awarded bravery medals

PITTSBURGH — Former pro football player Joe Delaney, who died attempting to save two children from drowning, was among 21 people awarded the Carnegie Medal for bravery Monday.

Six of the 21 died in their rescue attempts.

Delaney, 24, a running back for the Kansas City Chiefs, died in 1983 while attempting to save two boys who were floundering in a Louisiana pond. Delaney, who was relaxing near the water, heard the commotion and ran into the water where

the boys were last seen.

Upon reaching the area, Delaney also went under the water and failed to surface.

One of the children, Lanser Perkins, 11, was rescued by others, but died the following morning in a hospital. Harry Holland Jr., 11, died during the mishap.

The awards, issued by the Pittsburgh-based Carnegie Hero Fund Commission, were granted to people in 13 states and one Canadian province. Among the criteria for consideration is that the rescuer must risk his life.

Several honors went to people

from Texas, including Joel Quintanilla.

The Austin man attempted to save Matthew Hansen's life when a fire broke out at the Texas state capital in Austin in February 1983. Quintanilla, 56, a security guard, was searching the second floor apartment area when he heard cries for help.

Quintanilla broke the door down and was knocked down himself by a rush of flame and heat. Hansen died in the apartment of smoke inhalation and his rescuer suffered severe burns and smoke inhalation.

15-year-old declared hero

FORT WORTH — A 15-year-old cross country runner was officially declared a hero Monday for saving his infant cousin from a burning house last summer. A few years ago he had saved the baby's father from drowning.

Jesus Sanchez was notified Monday that he will receive a medal and \$2,500 from the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission in Pittsburgh for his heroics.

The 5-foot-6, 110-pound high school junior said his formula for heroism is simple: "Think about other people instead of yourself."

Sanchez was in his northside home last July 1 when a sister called

to tell him a relative's house was on fire.

Sanchez, a member of his school's cross country running team, dashed to the house to find a bedroom in flames and his 18-month-old cousin Carlito trapped inside.

A group of adults outside the house had already given up on trying to rescue the baby because of the hot flames. Sanchez said he dodged past the adults as they tried to stop him and raced through the thick smoke to Carlito's crib.

"I don't know what made me do it," he said. "I wasn't afraid at that moment."

"It was pretty dark. I couldn't see much but I saw the white of his diaper. He was in his crib. He was already unconscious," Sanchez said.

The infant cousin, who recovered from third-degree burns, is not the only member of the family who owes his life to Sanchez' bravery.

The youth also saved the baby's father, Marco Sanchez, from drowning a few years ago.

The two were fishing from inner tubes on the Trinity River when Marco Sanchez fell in.

"He can't swim," said Jesus. "He was drowning. I pulled him out."

GM to retool five plants in 1987

DETROIT — General Motors Corp. plans to retool five assembly plants in the United States and Canada to produce new mid-sized cars beginning in 1987, a trade publication reported Monday.

Metalworking News said the autos, dubbed the W-cars, will be GM's biggest new car project in years. They will replace current front-wheel drive and rear-wheel drive autos.

The automaker said it would have no comment on the report.

Metalworking News said GM would retool assembly plants in Arlington, Texas; Doraville, Ga.; Oklahoma City, Okla.; Oshawa, Ont. and Ste. Therese, Que., to produce the autos. The cars will debut in spring or fall, 1987.

The W-cars will replace current rear-wheel drive Chevrolet Monte Carlo, Pontiac Grand Prix, Oldsmobile Cutlass Supreme and Buick Regal models, as well as the front-wheel drive Chevrolet Celebrity, Oldsmobile Cutlass Ciera and Buick Century autos.

Metalworking News said the Arlington plant is expected to be converted first to W-car assembly in spring, 1986, while the Oshawa plant will be the last to be remodeled in winter, 1987.

GM also plans to introduce another line called the L-cars in 1987. These will be built in Linden, N.C. and Wilmington, Del., said the trade publication.

The W- and L-cars are expected to make up 45 percent of GM's sales or close to 3 million autos, according to the newspaper.
