Galleon dispute settled

AUSTIN - The state Monday announced the settlement for \$313,000 of a dispute over the salvage of a 16th century Spanish galleon that is believed to have sunk off the Texas coast 430 years ago

Attorney General Jim Mattox said the settlement resolves a 17-year-old legal controversy that arose before passage in 1969 of the Texas Antiquities Code, which now protects recovery of pre-20th vessels from state-owned submerged lands.

The agreement, which negates two pending lawsuits, confirms the state's ownership of the priceless ar-tifacts recovered in 1967 from the Espiritu Santo, and provides that the state will retain custody of the trea-

The treasure included silver coins, a small gold cross and silver

The Espiritu Santo is believed to have sunk in 1554 during a violent storm about one-half mile off the coast of Padre Island while enroute from the New World to Spain.

Archaelogists say it is apparently the oldest New World shipwreck ever exavacated and represents one of the most important remnants of the Spanish era in Texas.

The shipwreck was found in 15-

20 feet of water, but the ship was buried beneath another four to 10 feet of sand which had acted as a cacoon to preserve the wreckage.

The agreement resolved the salavage claims of Platoro Limited, Inc., vage claims of Platoro Limited, Inc., a Gary, Ind., private salvage company that headed the 1967 recovery project, and two joint venturers, William Kenon Jr., a Brownsville shrimp boat operator, and George K. Purvis, a California diver.

A lawsuit was filed to halt the recovery operations by Platoro in 1967 and require the salvage company to

and require the salvage company to return the treasure to Texas from Indiana, where it had been stored.

The artifacts are now in the custody of the Texas Antiquities Commission and are undergoing analysis at the University of Texas in Austin.




