## Atomic bomb turns 39

WHITE SANDS MISSILE RANGE, N.M. — The atomic bomb turned 39 years old this week, but the birthday will not be observed until Oct. 6.

"Fat Man" — the first atomic bomb — was tested July 16, 1945, in the desert at a spot named Trinity Site by physicist Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, who directed the project that produced the bomb at Los Alamos National Laboratory.

Because temperatures reach into the 100s during the summer, the military opens the site to the public only on the first Saturday of October each year. This year, the military will allow carefully controlled car caravans to carry visitors to Trinity Site for a modest ceremony.

Less than a month later, on Aug. 6, 1945, another atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima, Japan, followed by a second atomic blast Aug. 9, 1945, at Nagasaki. More than

100,000 people died in those blasts and, by Aug. 14, Japan surrendered and World War II ended.

White Sands Missile Range spokesman Jim Eckles said officials hope to complete restoration of the ranch house where the bomb was assembled by the October date.

Next year, the 40th anniversary, Eckles said the missile range plans to observe the event with a more extensive ceremony, but plans for that observance will not be started for another 10 months.

The National Park Service dedicated Trinity site as a National Historical landmark on Oct. 4, 1975, a little more than 30 years after the first atomic explosion was triggered at 5:29:45 a.m. Mountain War Time.

With that first blast came an incredible burst of light, which bathed the surrounding mountains in an unearthly brilliance, followed within

seconds by a shock wave and a derous roar.

Glass windows were shattered, Silver City, N.M., 120 miles from site, but the George McDermott ranch house, where the bomb was assembled just two miles away from ground zero, remained intact.

"You have to understand shock waves do funny things," Eckles said. "They sometimes bounce over buildings. There is no way to know why the ranch house was spared."

Few signs of the historic explosion remain. Trinity — the green spherule formed when the bomb's blast hit the desert sand — has been scattered, scattered and bulldozed away. Only a lava rock monument and bronze plaques mark Ground Zero.

Official WSMR materials said radioactivity in the area subsided years after the explosion, perhaps the first public viewing of the site in 1953 by a crowd estimated at 700 people.

## Macy's opens Houston store
