Foley's is trying to gear the store to the community, Billingsley said. Colors on items such as store signs, stationary and business cards have been changed to burgandy instead of the orange in the Austin store and the blue in the Houston stores.

Residents in the area were surveyed about what they wanted in the store and store plans have been changed to meet those needs, Billinsley said. The size of the wom-en's department was tripled, he said.




