## Stocks score big gain

NEW YORK — The stock market scored its biggest gain in six weeks Wednesday on volume of 127 million shares in what investors hope will be a revival of the bull market that began in August 1982.

Pension funds, with a lot of money to spend on the first day of the month, were big investors in the rally that was based on hopes interest rates will ease now that the economy appears to be cooling off.

High-technology stocks paced the stampede of buying following news the Senate had passed legislation that liberalizes joint research and development projects. Motors also scored and oils rebounded from a recent slump.

The Dow Jones industrial average, which rose 5.30 Tuesday, soared 19.33 to 1,134.61, the biggest gain since it rose 22.75 on June 18. The Dow has risen 48.04 points since hitting a 17-month low a week ago Tuesday.

The New York Stock Exchange index climbed 1.85 to 88.58 and the price of an average share increased 62 cents. Advances led declines 1,361-306 among the 1,974 issues traded at 4 p.m. EDT.

The Big Board volume of 127,520,000 shares, up from 86,910,000 traded Tuesday, was the heaviest since 128,111,140 changed hands Feb. 9. It was the fourth heaviest turnover of the year.

## Birth control ban affirmed by pope

VATICAN CITY — Pope John Paul II, reaffirming the Roman Catholic Church's ban on artificial birth control, Wednesday called for chastity in marriage as the only way to reconcile married love with responsible parenthood.

The pope made the statements as part of his weekly interpretations of Vatican documents relating to birth control at his weekly general audience before 10,000 pilgrims in St. Peter's square.

He cited passages from the Second Vatican Council "Gaudium et Spes" (Joy and Hope) and Pope Paul VI's encyclical "Humanae Vitae" (On Human Life).

The Council's document was issued in the mid-1960s by some Roman Catholics as opening the way for couples to use their own judgment in deciding how many children to have.

He said in deciding to avoid ing a child, a married couple "must make their action conform to the creative intention of God."

The only two methods of contraception permitted by the Catholic church are abstaining from sex, observing chastity and the so-called "rhythm" method based on a woman's monthly fertility cycle.

## Legislation proposed

WASHINGTON — Legislation to establish a veteran's hospital in south Texas was introduced Wednesday by Reps. Kika de la Garza and Solomon Ortiz, both D-Texas, who said it could serve nearly a half-million veterans.

They said there are 100,000 veterans in their two districts alone and South Texas also is a winter home to thousands of veterans from around the nation.

veterans," said de la Garza. "Given the sizable number, how can the need for suitable medical facility fail to be recognized?"

"All of our veterans have already paid the price for this legislation," said Ortiz. "And I don't think we have given them the care they deserve. This veteran's hospital must now be a priority."

De la Garza said he first introduced legislation in 1965 to build a VA in South Texas and the cost of construction per bed has since jumped from \$26,000 to \$275,000.


