Even if the problems hindering the fifth generation make the outlook less bright, future applications of today's technology shine out.

"Computers are a tremendous device for learning math, music and logic," says Dr. John Hoyle of the College of Education 'Computers will be a great help to classroom teachers. Ninety percent of all children can learn class materials if they are given enough time to work with them. The computer will give them that time. By having a

computer in the classroom and at home, students could take the amount of time they need to make sure they learn basic information before they are advanced. Education in inner cities could be improved by having computers at work stations. By having computers at various places, such as in a neighborhood, all children — even those too poor to afford computers - can
