

becomes. Some problems could expand exponentially. Millions of processors would be needed to work them.

Even if the problems hindering the fifth generation make the outlook less bright, future applications of today's technology shine out.

"Computers are a tremendous device for learning math, music and logic," says Dr. John Hoyle of the College of Education.

"Computers will be a great help to classroom teachers. Ninety percent of all children can learn class materials if they are given enough time to work with them. The computer will give them that time. By having a computer in the classroom and at home, students could take the amount of time they need to make sure they learn basic information before they are advanced."

Education in inner cities could be improved by having computers at work stations. By having computers at various places, such as in a neighborhood, all children — even those too poor to afford computers — can have access to a computer. And adults also will be able to use the computers for finding jobs, figuring income taxes or finding places to shop. But the computer advantages do have drawbacks.

"We risk becoming a Pac-Man generation and interacting with computers only," Hoyle says. "We may create a society that is isolated from human relations."

A family resource specialist here agrees that there is a risk of being consumed by the computer. Mary Nance, who works for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, says depends on whether the family members are willing to share or not.

"The future computer can be an educational tool, and provide opportunities for both parent and child to learn together," she says. "But it could lead to a situation where our child stays on a computer to an excess."

Another area for future computer use is as a household appliance. Be don't expect to call home for a computer-cooked roast. Nance doesn't see future houses controlled by computers.

"I'm not sure that people want to take themselves out of control in the house and let electronic control take over," she says. "The trend now is putting micro-processor technology on individual appliances, instead having a single computer controlling all the appliances."

Another person studying current trends to predict the future is Dr. Larry Hickman, who teaches a philosophy course here on technology and human values. He believes the future computers will contribute most in underdeveloped countries. One example would be with "expert" systems (programs). Computers are now small enough to load "expert" systems into small battery-operated computers for use in third world countries. The programs will allow doctors to make better diagnosis of medical problems. It will be as good as having a medical specialist there, he says.

"We're beginning to see some use already. The medical community is very interested in expert programs"
