Hightower rides local of melons

HOUSTON — Texas Agriculture Commissioner Jim Hightower rode into town on an 18-wheel truckload of watermelons Tuesday to draw attention to the state's program to help farmers market their produce directly to food stores.

"It's often been said that I'm dumb I came to town on a load of watermelons. Well, I did that to link up producers with consumers," Hightower said.

Hightower led a procession of lawmakers and 17 members of a newly-formed co-op of 17 watermelon farmers from Hempstead who have arranged to sell 1 million pounds of melons this season to 103 Kroger stores in Houston via the Texas Department of Agriculture's new direct marketing program.

Under the program, the TDAs helps small farmers who to organize and market their produce directly to food stores.

The Kroger chain is the first company to take part in the program in Houston.

"For years, these farmers in the Hempstead area have produced some of the finest-tasting watermelons in the United States, but a portion of their crop has had to be fed to livestock or left in the field rot because they lacked access to significant markets, like Houston," Hightower said.

Through direct marketing, farmers sell more of their produce for a higher price, thus enabling stores to pay less for the produce, eliminating the middleman — generally wholesalers.

"This is important on three levels," Hightower said. "The farmer who didn't have a market before now has one and they're getting three times the prices for their goods."

"But the consumer gets cheaper prices and a higher quality melon market. And the Texas economy benefits because instead of buying melons from Georgia, we're buying Texas melons from Texas farmers and the money stays in the state," Hightower said.

Ollie Williams, president of Hempstead farmers co-op, said members previously sold their melons at roadside stands and farmers' markets for about 1 cent a pound. Now, they're getting 3 cents per pound. Now, they're earning 6 cents to 7 1/2 cents a pound for the melons, Williams said.

"We've increased our profit by 10 percent per acre," Williams said.

The co-op members farm about 700 acres in the Hempstead area. In the past, they have sold just over 25,000 pounds of watermelons.

Co-op members are now selling 90 percent of their produce to Kroger.

The co-op shipped its first load of watermelons to Kroger's Houston warehouse on July 12.

Bob Everingham, vice president of Kroger's Houston market area, said the agreement helps the company increase minority participation in its stores and also helps firm maintain lower food prices.

"Our involvement with the Hempstead co-op makes good business sense. We were selling melons for \$3.99 before and this week they're going for \$1.88. We think that's good for us and consumers," Everingham said.

Hightower said the TDAs direct marketing program was created last year with a \$115,000 appropriation from the Texas Legislature.
