## Moore has Raiders optimistic

LUBBOCK, Texas — Texas Tech football coach Jerry Moore Tuesday said the hiring of five new coaches promised an optimistic season for the Red Raiders — a team whose last winning season was 1978.

'We're just kind of on the verge of feeling like we're going to get good," Moore said of his team. "I've got as good a coaching staff as there is around. The biggest difference for us (the coaching staff) is the maturity

Only two of Moore's nine assistant coaches are working the same posts they had one year ago

The five new coaches include of-fensive coordinator and quarterback coach Tom Wilson; defensive coordinator and linebacker coach Spike Dykes, offensive line coach Clovis Hale, defensive ends coach Dick Winder and secondary coach Carlos Mainord

The Raiders were tied for first place in the Southwest Conference for the first half of last season, but ended 3-7-1 for the year with a narrow miss at tying for third place in the league. Another plus for Moore is that


fense," Moore said, adding his fall squad includes 27 seniors and 15 fourth-year juniors. "Offensively we're going to stay about the same. We're probably


