**Sailing club merges  
with windsurfing club**

The Texas A&M Sailing Club and the Windsurfing Club merged early this July and Ed Cook, former secretary-treasurer of the Windsurfing Club, said he thinks both clubs will benefit.

The clubs got together to better accommodate the members of both clubs, Cook said. Before the merge, the Windsurfing Club had no windsurfing boards of its own while the Sailing Club had two boards.

The Windsurfing Club was founded in the fall of 1981. Being merged with a larger club, Cook said, will enable better organization for those people who want to windsurf.

When asked if there were any possible conflicts as a result of the merging of the two clubs, Cook said that some members of the former Windsurfing Club might feel that too much attention will be placed on the sailing group. "Hopefully though, that will not happen," Cook said.

Jackie Schuster, treasurer of the Sailing Club, estimates that 75 to 125 people will join the new club, and sees no conflicts in the merging of

the two clubs, only advantages.

First, the Sailing Club will increase in membership, and second, the club will have more than two boards to teach members how to ride, she said.

For \$25, you can join the Sailing Club which gives you the use of all equipment, instructions in both sailing and windsurfing, refreshments, and instructions for different water safety techniques.

Outings are held every other week at Yegua Park in Lake Somerville, and there are about seven outings a semester, Cook said.

If you want to windsurf only, you pay a \$15 fee, which lets you use a windsurfer. If you own your own windsurfer or sailboat, you can join and campout with the other members for a \$10 social fee.

Cook said that members of the Sailing Club will elect officers next fall.

The Sailing Club will have Windsurfers and a catamaran on display on Wednesday August 29, in front of Rudder Fountain. At 7 pm Wednesday in 137 MSC, a videotape will be played to promote interest in windsurfing and the Sailing Club.

**Operator handles  
emergency calls  
for on, off campus**

For on-campus emergencies, from serious medical problems to a broken pipe dumping water into your dormitory room, dial 9911 for the 24-hour emergency operator located on campus.

The operator at the 9911 number can contact the Texas A&M Emergency Medical Services, the University Police, the College Station Fire Department or the University Physical plant.

Off-campus students can dial 845-1111 for the same emergency operator.

Starting in October the emergency dispatcher will use a procedure developed by the Salt Lake City Fire Department to aid medical emergency patients before the ambulance arrives, said Steven Ellerbe, a captain with the Texas A&M Emergency Medical Services and a senior biology major.

The dispatcher will ask callers for

location, basic nature of the injury and other questions necessary to send the ambulance.

Using a flowchart and flip card system the dispatcher will ask the caller more detailed questions and the ambulance is dispatched and can give the caller first-aid directions, Ellerbe said. This enables the dispatcher to accurately tell the ambulance crew what to expect and to keep them informed while en route to the patient.

"The system is not designed to screen calls," Ellerbe stressed. "We send a unit on every call. We never refuse transport."

The Texas A&M Emergency Medical Services handle the University campus and can respond to anyone in the Burleson and Brazos Counties outside of the College Station city limits. They are not allowed by the College Station Fire Department to respond to calls in the city.

**Homemade signs banned  
during Reagan's speech**

CINCINNATI — A White House advance man Tuesday denied that he ordered that all homemade signs be kept off Fountain Square during President Reagan's appearance there last Monday.

Bill Brennan told the Cincinnati Post he recommended to local Republicans that they invoke such a ban because it "would certainly expedite people getting into the square." But he said it was not an order and not normal White House procedure.

Anthony Reissig, a local GOP official who acted as liaison with the White House on Reagan's appearance last Monday, said Brennan and another advance man specifically ordered the ban.

Dozens of people who showed up with pro- and anti-Reagan posters and signs at last week's presidential appearance had them confiscated prior to their being allowed onto the square. However, once the spectators passed through metal detectors, many were handed pro-Reagan signs by GOP loyalists, thus effectively keeping most anti-Reagan signs off the square and out of camera range.

White House spokeswoman Kim Hoggard told the Cincinnati Post it is not White House policy to ban signs at presidential appearance.

"It is standard Secret Service policy to reject signs that present a security hazard. It is not White House policy to reject any signs, period," she said.

But Reissig said Brennan and Jim Kuhn, assistant to the director of the White House advance office, specifically ordered him to recruit volunteers to collect all signs at the entrances to the square.

"They said, 'We're going to need some people,' and that there will be no signs permitted on the square, and they also said it was for the safety of the president and for convenience due to that we only had two openings to the square and the number of people that would be coming through," he told the Post.

About a half-dozen people whose signs were seized have threatened bringing suit over the incident, charging that their right to free speech was abridged.

Kenneth Blackwell, a Hamilton County co-chairman of the Reagan-Bush reelection campaign, apologized earlier this week for the incident.
