WASHINGTON - Federal action turning over a workhorse satel-lite launcher to private industry has touched off a space trade war that has an American company crying

As a result, U.S. Trade Representative William E. Brock has begun an investigation into the pricing practices of Arianespace, the French firm that is offering the unmanned Ariane rocket to companies and governments with satellites to launch.

Not only does Ariane compete with NASA's space shuttle, but it is seeking business of the type that used to be handled by NASA's reliable Delta rocket.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration, at the urging of President Reagan, turned over the Delta satellite launching program in May to Transpace Carriers Inc., a company formed specifically to market and launch Deltas.

But Transpace has yet to sign up a customer, although spokesman Den-nis Ahern said the company is negotiating with several potential custom-

The company blames Arianespace for its troubles, claiming that the French firm is engaged in "predatory pricing," cutting prices for launch services to American customers 25 percent to 33 percent below charges for similar services to European customers.

The European Space Agency, which developed the Ariane, said in a memo filed to the trade office that the practices and policies followed by the members of ESA "are in no way unreasonable ... nor do these practices-policies in any way affect the economic interests of the United

Seven of the nine Arianes have been launched so far have been successful, including the May 22 orbit ing of a communications satellit owned by the GTE Spacenet Corpo McLean, Va. Spacenet was the first American satellite to be launched outside of the United States.

Douglass Astronautics Corp., ha launched 163 satellites over the par 24 years and has an overall 97 p cent success rate. Its last 40 laundings have been successful.

State medical board issues complaint against doctor

DALLAS - People suffering from cancer, heart disease, diabetes and a host of other ailments go to Dr. Ann Bhuket looking for a cure, but a state medical board complaint alleges she is a charlatan.

The complaint claims Bhuket, who practices in Plano, is guilty of using unorthodox and harmful means to treat at least six patients.

Bhuket, a native of Thailand who

went to medical school in Bangkok and completed her internship at Baylor Medical Center in Houston, practices holistic medicine.

Her stated medical theory distributed to patients includes the belief that "just as illness is a progressive degenerative process, so is wellness a progressive improvement program.' Her treatments include "mental and spiritual counseling.

They also include what has been described as "all kinds of make-believe machines" supposedly used as diagnostic tools.
