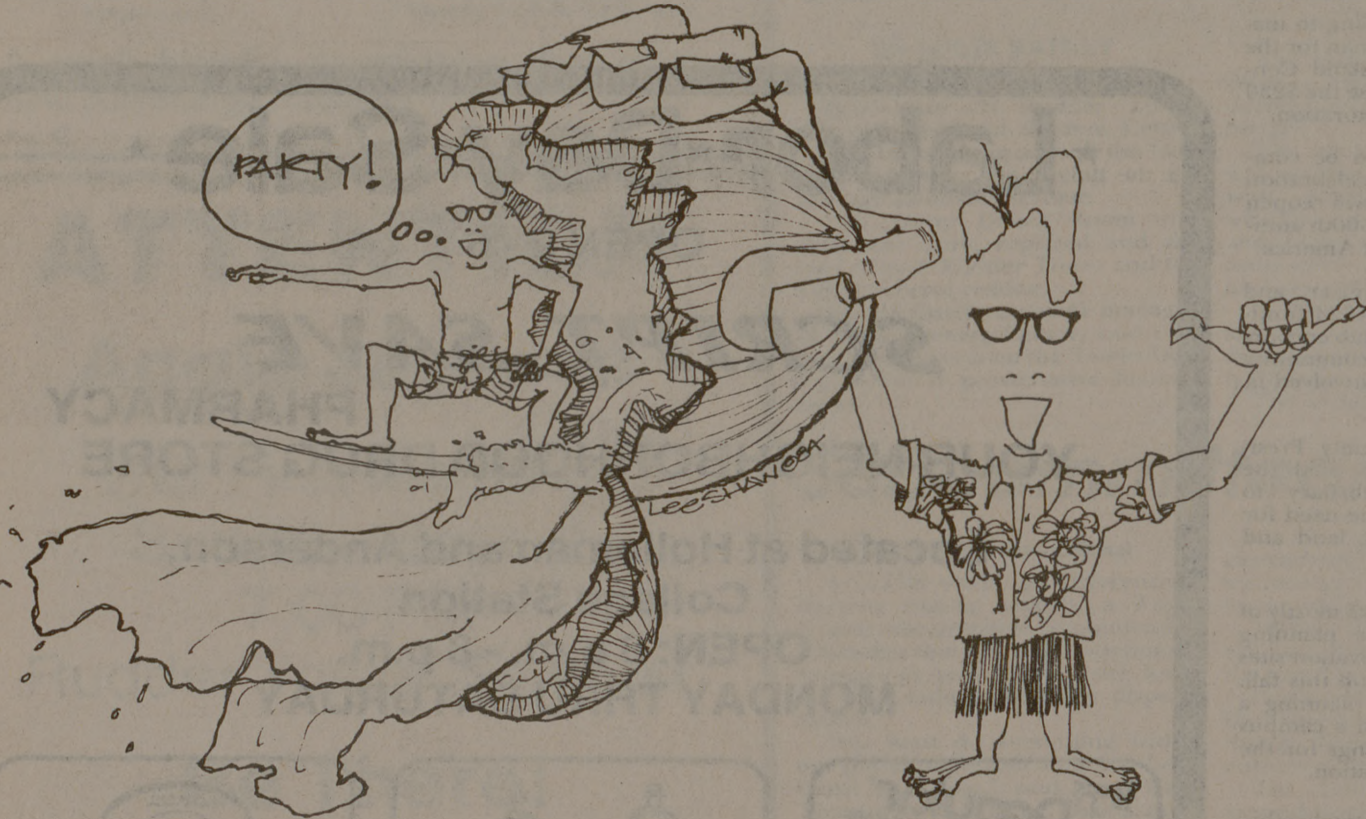
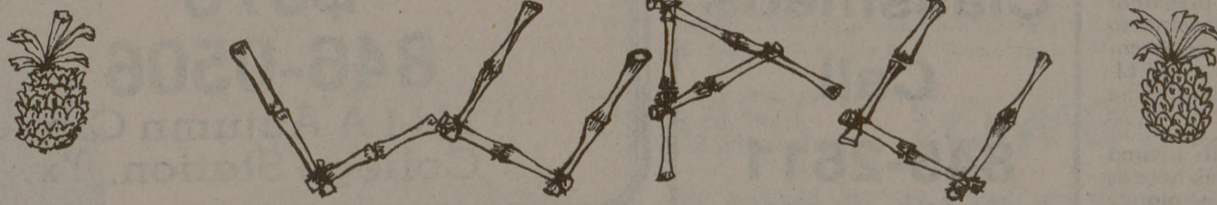

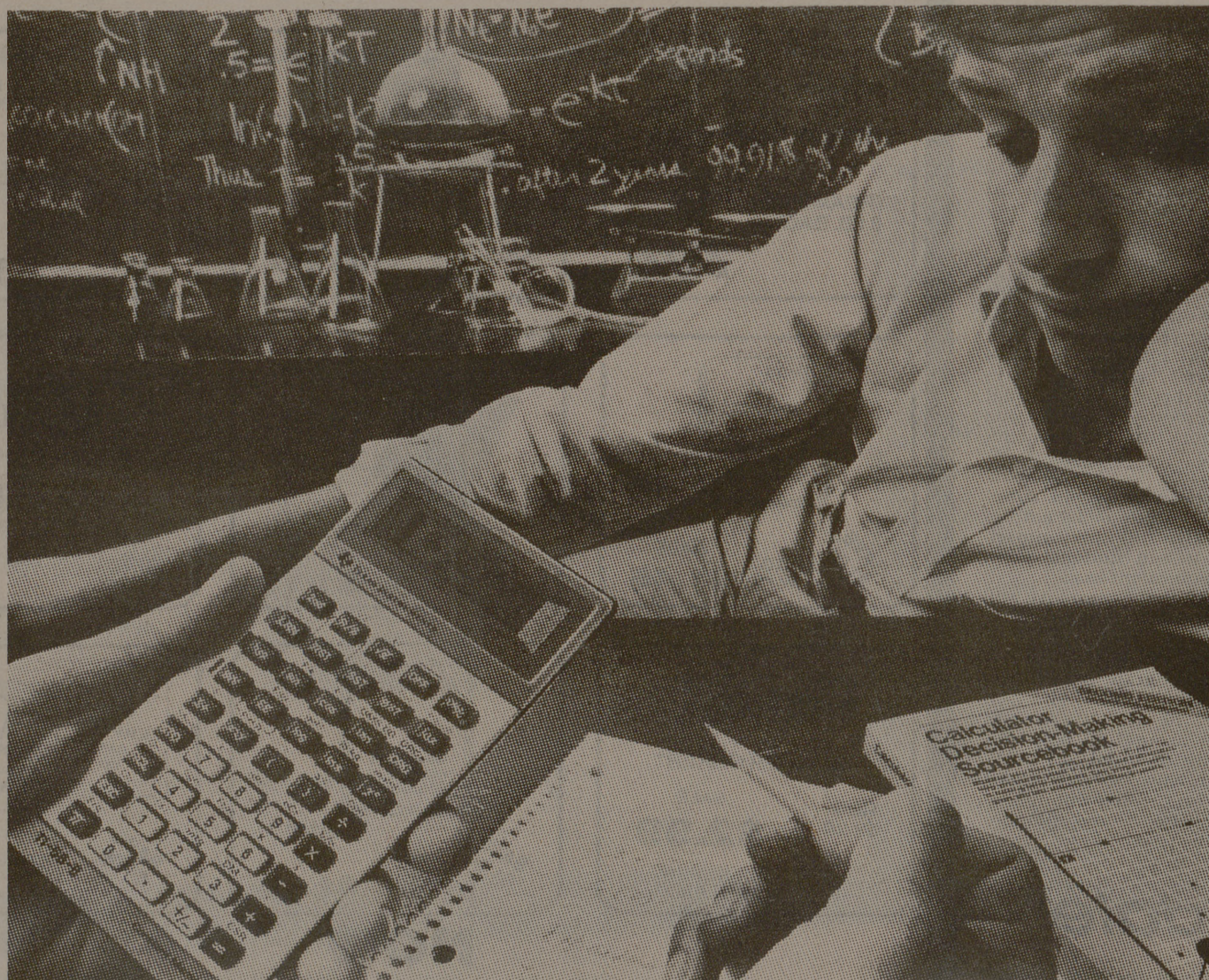

**Nominees sought for Fulbright Grants**

Applications for Fulbright Grants will be available in the Study Abroad Office, 101 Academic Building, through Oct. 1. Over 700 of these awards will be available for the 1985-86 school year. The purpose of these grants is to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and other countries through the exchange of persons, knowledge and skills. They are provided under the terms of the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961 and by foreign governments, universities, corporations and private donors.

**Humanities grants available to students**

Guidelines and application forms for the Younger Scholars Program of the National Endowment for the Humanities are now available for photocopying in the Placement Office. The program will award up to 100 grants nationally to students under 21 to conduct their own research and do writing projects in the fields of history, philosophy and literature. Recipients of these awards will receive a stipend of \$1,800 and be expected to work full time for nine weeks during the summer of 1985, researching and writing a humanities paper under the close supervision of a humanities scholar. Application deadline is Oct. 15.

**Tropical storm June kills 28 in Philippines**

MANILA, Philippines — Raging floods unleashed by tropical storm June hampered relief efforts Thursday in the northern Philippines, where landslides and neck-deep waters left at least 28 people dead and hundreds of thousands homeless. President Ferdinand Marcos declared 21 provinces disaster areas in the wake of the storm, granting rescue agencies broad powers to allocate emergency supplies. June, which hit a group of tiny islands off the northernmost tip of the archipelago on Wednesday, churned toward Hong Kong Thursday packing 62 mph winds. Heavy rains still pounded the north coast of the Philippines and a second tropical storm, Ike, is brewing in the Pacific and is forecast to affect weather over the Philippines as early as Friday. At least 28 people were killed, 207 were injured and eight were declared missing in two days of landslides and flooding unleashed by June, according to reports compiled from the Red Cross, the Office of Civil Defense and the Philippine News Agency. Among the casualties were a family of five crushed to death when a landslide flattened their home and a 20-year-old man swept away by floodwaters as he tried to save a drowning pig, PNA reported. Philippine Air Force C-130 transport planes loaded with tons of rice, canned milk and medicine flew from Manila to stricken areas Thursday.

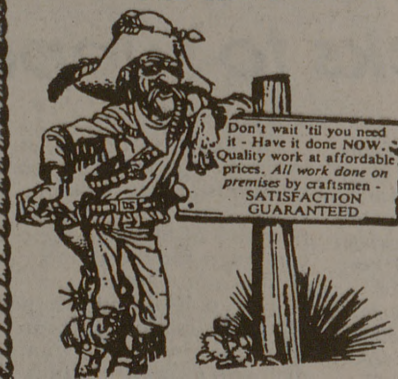
