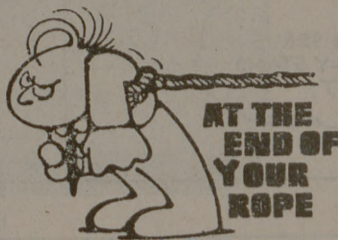

McEnroe toys with opponent

NEW YORK — John McEnroe and John Lloyd advanced to the fourth round of the U.S. Open Championships Sunday, one requiring little more than a workout and the other playing the match of his life.

To no one's surprise, the top-seeded McEnroe toyed with South African Kevin Moir 6-3, 6-0, 6-3. In the three matches McEnroe has played to this point, he has yielded only 12 games.

For apparent reason, McEnroe couldn't work up too much enthusiasm about beating an opponent with a world ranking of 335.

"I'd never seen the guy play before, and in that situation you're a little bit unsure," said McEnroe, who allowed only nine points in the second set. "I was very glad just to get it over with."

Lloyd, though, who occasionally has been lost in the shadow of his wife, Chris Evert, was ecstatic after upsetting seventh seed Johan Kriek 2-6, 7-6 (10-8), 6-2, 6-3.

"This is probably my finest match ever," said Lloyd, who is ranked 49th in the world to No. 8 for Kriek. "I've played as well for two sets, but considering the place and the quality of the match, it's my best ever."

Lloyd has suffered through an erratic career, never living up to his potential, and at age 30 he now says, "I think I'm a new player. I try to concentrate on just one match at a time. The way I'm playing now, someone will have to play very well to beat me."

Kriek, after taking the opening set with breaks in the second and eighth games, broke service in the 12th game of the second set to force a tie-break. He had a set point at 7-6 that would have put him two sets up, but he just fell short.

"I think I played a solid match," he said. "I've been playing extremely well the past few days and had some unbelievably tough matches with guys who are supposed to be routine."

"You can control a lot of things, but you cannot control how the guy across the net plays. Today was one of those days."

Once he captured the tie-break, Lloyd was well in control. Kriek opened the third set with a service break, but Lloyd countered with breaks in the second, sixth and eighth games. Lloyd then made the decisive break of the fourth set in the sixth game.

Joining McEnroe and Lloyd in the round of 16 was No. 16 seed Joakim Nystrom of Sweden, who rallied for a 5-7, 5-7, 6-3, 6-3, 6-0 victory over Sandy Mayer.

Defending champion Jimmy Connors met Frenchman Henri Leconte later in the day.

All five seeded women in action Sunday were successful. Pam Shriver defeated Peanut Louie 6-3, 7-5; No. 8 Claudia Kohde beat Caterina Lindqvist 2-6, 6-2, 6-2. No. 9 Lisa Bonder beat Yvonne Vermaak 6-1, 6-0; No. 13 Wendy Turnbull defeated Beverly Mould 6-3, 1-6, 6-1; and No. 15 Barbara Potter outlasted Patty Fendick 6-2, 4-6, 6-2.

Unseeded Helena Sukova claimed the final berth in the round of 16 by beating 14-year-old Gabriela Sabatini of Argentina, playing in only her fifth professional tournament, 6-4, 6-4.

Horton, Sutter handcuff Astros with four hitter

ST. LOUIS — Ricky Horton and Bruce Sutter combined on a four-hitter and David Green hit a home run Sunday to lead the St. Louis Cardinals to a 4-1 victory over the Houston Astros.

Horton, 9-3, gave up four hits in 7 2-3 innings, striking out four and walking four. Sutter pitched the final innings for his 37th save—equaling his career high and tying him with Rollie Fingers and Clay Carroll for the National League record.

Joe Niekro, 13-10, was the loser, going for 2-3 innings and yielding five hits and four runs.

St. Louis took a 3-0 lead in the first. Willie McGee singled and stole second, Tom Herr walked and Terry Pendleton singled to load the bases. Lonnie Smith drove in McGee with a grounder, forcing Pendleton at second. Smith then stole second and the throw from catcher Alan Ashby went into center, allowing Herr to score and moving Smith to third. Smith scored on Andy Van Slyke's grounder.

The Cardinals made it 4-0 in the second when Green led off the inning with his 12th home run of the season, a shot to left field.

Houston closed to 4-1 in the fifth when Bert Pena hit his first major-league home run.
