## Donley becomes 'target' after Hill injures shoulder

DALLAS — Throughout the years the Dallas Cowboys have had two pass-catch combinations that have worked special magic.

First there was Don Meredith-to-Bob Hayes and then there was Roger Staubach-to-Drew Pearson.

Now it is the hope of Dallas coaches and followers that Gary Hogeboom-to-Doug Donley will follow in that tradition.

During the course of a long evening in Anaheim Monday night, under the glare of the national spotlight, Hogeboom passed his first National Football League test with rave reviews.

But as much confidence as Hogeboom gathered for himself during the Cowboys' 20-13 win over the Los Angeles Rams, Donley matched him stride for stride.

"It was a big game for all of us," said Hogeboom, who was made the surprise starter by Head Coach Tom Landry and who came through with a franchise record 33 completions for 343 yards.

"But it was really a big game for Doug and I'm pleased for him."

Hogeboom had to live through a week of intense publicity after being named by Landry to replace Danny White as the Cowboys' starting quarterback. But little attention had been focused on Donley until he caught nine passes for 137 yards against the Rams.

Donley caught just 23 passes during his entire first three years with the Cowboys and although he has excellent speed and outstanding hands, he has had more than his share of injuries.

Once again during this year's training camp he came down with a shoulder injury and his reputation for being brittle only intensified.

"I've taken a bad rap (about being injury prone), and I've been sensitive to it," said Donley. I decided I would just go out and do what I know I can do.

"I really let it get to me. I had never been in that situation before where people were saying the kinds of things they were saying."

Donley became a part of the starting lineup this year because of Pearson's retirement and he became Hogeboom's chief target Monday night when fellow wide receiver Tony Hill was forced to leave the game with a separated shoulder.

Donley made the catch of the night in the fourth quarter when he snared a ball with his left hand and then held on after taking a tremendous hit from a Rams' defender.

On the next play Tony Dorsett wasted little time in scoring the winning touchdown on a 7-yard run.

"I don't think I'll forget that catch for a while," said Donley. "The ball

was a little behind me as I reached back and the ball me. Coach Landry doesn't one-handed catches. He would rather see you drop two hands than catch it with one. He didn't say anything about it."

Donley will have even more sure on him next week after Landry announced he would be lost from the lineup for four to six weeks.

"We haven't made any decisions far as replacing Tony on the said Landry. "I don't know might be available as a replacement. Naturally, I'd rather have an injured receiver if we could find one."

Having traded away Butch Johnson during the season and having lost Drew Pearson's retirement, the Cowboys now have one wide receiver — Donley — played for the club in 1983.

The only other healthy receivers now on the roster are Mike Renfro, obtained from the trade for Butch Johnson and free agent rookie Kirk Platter.
