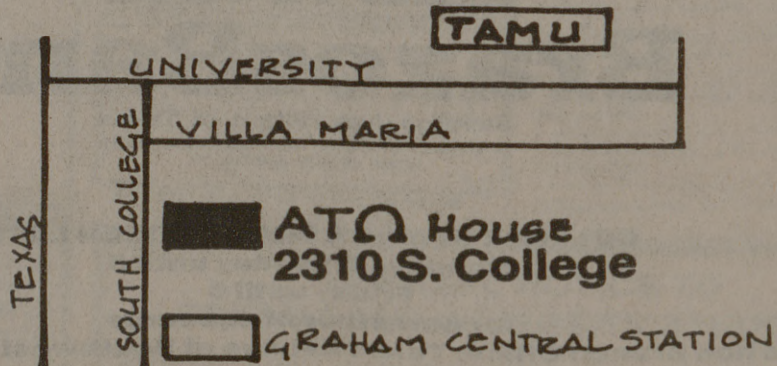

## Guardian Angels eye San Antonio

SAN ANTONIO — Six members of the Guardian Angels, including founder and president Curtis Sliwa, will meet with city officials and private citizens this week to assess the need for anti-crime patrols in the city's public housing projects.

Sliwa, a New York City restaurant manager who formed the Guardian Angels in 1979, Tuesday said he will meet with eight people who invited the group to establish a chapter in San Antonio.

The Guardians already have chapters that patrol streets watching for crime in Houston, Dallas, Fort Worth and Bryan-College Station.

"We are a third party in the streets," Sliwa said. "We will physically intervene."

Sliwa's wife, Lisa, a fashion model and active member in the non-profit anti-crime organization, recommended forming a San Antonio chapter after visiting the city last year, Sliwa said.

Sliwa said he would request meetings with Mayor Henry Cisneros and Police Chief Charles Rodriguez to

discuss forming a chapter. His group also was exploring the possibility of establishing a chapter, but that San Antonio is the priority.

The Guardian Angels, who wear uniforms of red berets and began riding New York City streets in 1979, providing citizen patrols in high crime areas.

The group currently has 5,000 members in 51 American and four Canadian cities, and is under way to open chapters in other cities, Sliwa said.

"It's time to begin in San Antonio," he said. "We will tour the city and discuss the need for local political and police officials in the next three days, we will personally in the homes of the people who invited us."

Sliwa said the Angels had had an easy road in Texas, where the initial opposition of officials, including Houston Police Chief Lee Brown. However, the group recently signed a cooperation agreement with Brown, who said changed his views on the controversial group.
