




SAN ANTONIO — Six members of the Guardian Angels, including founder and president Curtis Sliwa, will meet with city officials and private citizens this week to assess the need for anti-crime patrols in the

city's public housing projects. Sliwa, a New York City restaurant manager who formed the Guardian The group curr Angels in 1979, Tuesday said he will meet with eight people who invited the group to establish a chapter in San Antonio.

San Antonio. The Guardians already have chapters that patrol streets watching for crime in Houston, Dallas, Fort Worth and Bryan-College Station. "We are a third party in the streets," Sliwa said. "We will physi-cally intervene"
