1980, never had taken a set from Connors in three previous meetings, including a first rounder in the 1981 Open. But he achieved the first break Thursday, that coming in the fourth game at 15 when Connors sent a lob long.

Connors had to work long and hard to get it back. He had triple break point in the next game, only to have Lloyd come back to deuce, and it wasn't until his eighth chance that Connors gained the break with a lob.

A netted forehand by Lloyd, though, gave Connors the decisive service break in the 11th game. Lloyd had three break points in the 12th game, with a chance to force a tie-break, but eventually was long with a return to give Connors the
