Sheriff candidate Hill promises to fight vice

Rapid population growth in Brazos County has caused a number of crime problems associated with urban environments. To counteract such vices Democratic candidate for sheriff, Howard Hill, in a news conference Thursday, declared a "war on drugs" and "pledged to attempt to abolish prostitution in the south end of the county."

He said that he considers drug abuse the primary cause of crime in the nation. To combat illegal drugs he called for rigorous law enforcement through the use of undercover deputies and better cooperation with other law enforcement agencies in Brazos County and the Narcotics Task Force. However, Hill said, "education is the only way we will eliminate the illegal use of drugs."

If elected he said he plans to continue lecturing in the public schools on drug and alcohol abuse, as he did while working in the Bryan Police Dept.

While discussing how he would deal with prostitution, Hill commended the efforts of law enforcement officers over the last six months and indicated that he also

would use other available means, but refused to discuss them.

Hill also placed importance on the implementation of a 24-hour patrol consisting of three, 8-hour shifts, a program upgrading the sheriff's reserve, a 911 emergency telephone number for the county, a central dispatch location to reduce officer's response time, and a computer system for storage of all warrant information available to all law officers in the county.

To heighten community involvement and public awareness, Hill proposes a volunteer cadet program for young people interested in law enforcement. Use of reserve police officer has already saved Bryan residents \$30,000 worth of man-hours. Hill believes cadets would also save taxpayer's money. Cadets could assist in communications during peak traffic hours and provide valuable clerical assistance.

Hill has been involved in civic activities, as a P.T.A. president, both a defensive driving and first-aid instructor, and an organizer of Brazos County United Way.

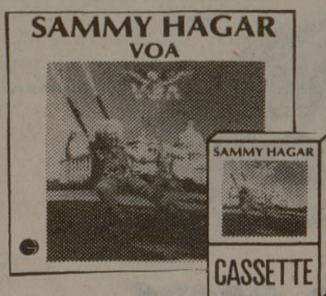

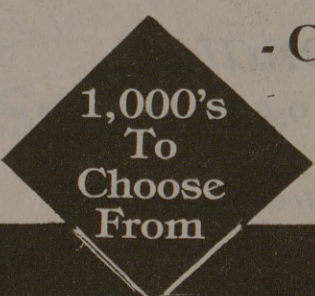
