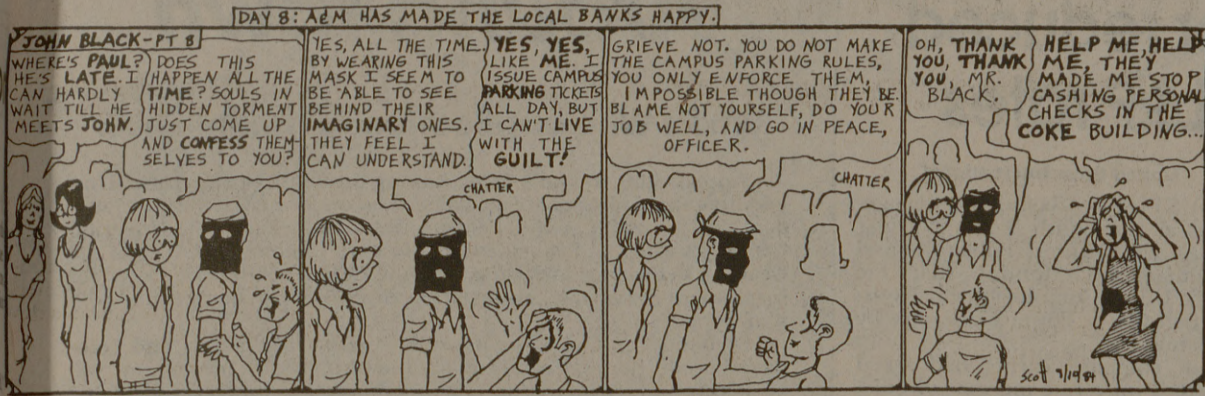

Shipwrecks could belong to states

 WASHINGTON — The House passes legislation Monday that gives states ownership of abandoned shipwrecks in state waters.  
 The measure, approved by voice vote, was intended to clarify who is responsible for managing shipwrecks. Recent federal court rulings have confused the issue, congressional sources said.  
 Rep. Jim Wright, D-Texas, is a co-sponsor of the measure. About 1,700 wrecks have been recorded off the Texas coast. The Bureau of Land Management has estimated there are 2,000 wrecks in the Gulf of Mexico.  
 "The overall intent of the legislation is to make clear the right of the states to manage these shipwrecks to enable them to preserve their historical significance," said Rep. Walter Jones, D-N.C., chairman of the Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee.  
 The law of salvage, which historically gives salvors the right to recover what they can from wrecks, does not apply to wrecks in state waters, which extend three miles offshore.  
 Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas, is a sponsor of the Senate version of the measure, which is pending in committee.

 WASHINGTON — The National Transportation Safety Board Monday urged the Coast Guard to set new maximum draft and speed requirements in the Louisiana waterway. The actions were prompted after the damaging oil spill caused when the British tanker Alvenus ran aground in the Calcasieu Ship Channel.  
 The July 30 rupture of the tanker's hull 11 miles south of Cameron, La., released 10,000 tons of crude oil into the Gulf of Mexico.  
 Some 3,000 tons of the gummy sludge washed ashore at Galveston within the next few days, fouling beaches and costing the tourist industry millions of dollars in lost business.  
 The crew of the Alvenus reported that the ship's maximum draft in salt water at the time it ran aground was 39 feet, 4 inches. The Louisiana state pilot aboard the Alvenus at that time said the channel had a project depth of 40 feet and was maintained by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at a depth of 42 feet.  
 The NTSB recommendation, endorsed by chairman Jim Burnett and vice chairman Patricia Goldsmith, asked the Coast Guard and Corps of Engineers to take immediate action to limit the draft and speed of vessels in the Calcasieu Ship Channel to avoid future accidents.
