Gramm told reporters that Doggett has received more than \$250,000 in contributions from Ea ern labor unions and some \$74,0 from a Boston organization of the Council for a Liveable World.

"These big-spending special inte est groups are currently investi hundreds of thousands of dollar the Mondale-Doggett ticket Texas," Gramm said during his We Texas campaign tour.
Gramm, a former Texas A&M

economics instructor, is also sche uled to visit Abilene, Amarik Borger, Dumas and Pampa. "It's an absurdity," Gramm saiding response to Doggett's statemen

that he accepted contributions fro nuclear power interest grou (Swisher and Deaf Smith coun are the Texas Panhandle sites und consideration for a national nuclea waste dump).
Gramm said his campaign recordshow that less than one-eighth of
