Gramm rebuts Doggett

LUBBOCK — Republican Senate candidate Phil Gramm accused his opponent Lloyd Doggett Monday of being more concerned about out-of-state special interest groups than about Texans.

Gramm also denied charges made by Doggett that he (Gramm) accepted contributions from special interest groups.

Gramm told reporters that Doggett has received more than \$250,000 in contributions from Eastern labor unions and some \$74,000 from a Boston organization called the Council for a Liveable World.

"These big-spending special interest groups are currently investing hundreds of thousands of dollars in the Mondale-Doggett ticket in Texas," Gramm said during his Wednesday campaign tour.

Gramm, a former Texas A&M economics instructor, is also scheduled to visit Abilene, Amarillo, Borger, Dumas and Pampa.

"It's an absurdity," Gramm said in response to Doggett's statements that he accepted contributions from nuclear power interest groups (Swisher and Deaf Smith counties are the Texas Panhandle sites under consideration for a national nuclear waste dump).

Gramm said his campaign records show that less than one-eighth of 1 percent of his contributions came from public utility employees. He added that it is illegal to accept contributions from corporations.

"I believe Texans want a U.S. senator who is committed to the well-being of those who do the work, pay the taxes and pull the wagon," Gramm said. "My opponent... is already neck-deep in debt to the special interest groups."

Gramm said Texas congressmen traditionally favor a strong, national defense. "He (Doggett) is opposed to the B-1 bomber and the M-X missile — weapons that we need for a strong secure defense and weapons that are produced in Texas."

Gramm added that Doggett supports the Gay Rights Bill, and that Texas gay and lesbian groups have launched a Doggett campaign drive to raise \$700,000.

"Doggett is the first U.S. Senate nominee from either party in Texas... who has actively solicited the support, endorsement and financial backing of homosexual activists," Gramm said.

Admiral talks on science

The former director of the National Security Agency, Admiral Bobby R. Inman, will speak on the relationship of Texas A&M and high-technology in Rudder Theater at 7 p.m.

Inman is the president and chief executive officer of the Microelectronics and Computer Technology Corporation (MCC) in Austin. He joined MCC in 1982.

Inman has been actively involved in the high-technology area. For more than 22 years, he organized international computer and communications espionage networks for the U.S. Navy, the Defense Intelligence Agency, the CIA and the National Security Agency. He is former deputy director of the CIA and was director of the N.S.A. from 1977 to 1981.

MCC is a consortium of 12 electronic and computer oriented companies that came together in 1982 to offset the Japanese advantage in the high-technology area. The aim of MCC is to eliminate the waste of repetitive research and to develop new technology more efficiently.

MCC chose Austin as their headquarters because of the favorable business climate in Texas. In addition, A&M and the University of Texas at Austin have pledged to further develop science and technology facilities.
