

No doubt: Tigers win the Series

 DETROIT — Kirk Gibson's two home runs and five runs batted in led the Detroit Tigers Sunday to an 8-4 defeat of the San Diego Padres, and the Tigers' first world championship in 16 years.

In taking the series four games to one, the Tigers, of the American League, made Sparky Anderson the first manager ever to win a World Series in both leagues. In 1975 and 1976, Anderson won with the Cincinnati Reds of the National League.

The victory touched off a wild celebration in the city. Thousands massed outside Tiger Stadium during the game in order to join the festivities. Many of the stadium crowd of 51,901 tried to get on the field but were restrained by at least 200 police, who ringed the field in a mostly futile effort to prevent fans from ripping up the turf.

Gibson hit a two-run homer in the first inning and a three-run blast in the eighth. And in the fifth he scored a tie-breaking run on a sacrifice fly to shallow right field.

Detroit catcher Parrish also hit one-run homer in the seventh.

Relief pitcher Aurelio Lopez, who took over in the fifth, also starred for the Tigers, retiring all seven batters he faced to notch the victory. Reliever Willie Hernandez, who surrendered a solo home run to the Padres' Kurt Bevacqua, got his second save of the series.



Reeves relies on run

 DENVER — Monday night's game in Mile High Stadium will be no duel between quarterbacks Lynn Dickey and John Elway if Denver Broncos coach Dan Reeves has his way.

And recently, Reeves has indeed had his way.

The Broncos are 5-1, running over folks offensively and defensively. Quarterback John Elway is playing a secondary role.

Denver, behind the Tom Jackson-led defense and the running of Sammy Winder and Gerald Willhite, are seeking their 10th consecutive home victory before a 105th straight home sellout crowd. Green Bay is 1-5.

Willhite, in the Broncos' first six games, has the best per-carry average among the top 20 runners in the AFC, 4.9 yards, and Winder is tied for second with 4.6 yards. Winder is third in the AFC in yardage at 433

and Willhite is 11th with 279.

The Broncos have outrushed their opponents 856 yards to 704 but the passing game has been a different story — the Broncos have been outpassed 1,581 yards to 1,006 and are last in the AFC.

Reeves said he expected trouble from Green Bay's James Lofton and John Jefferson, although the two have just 32 catches and one touchdown between them.

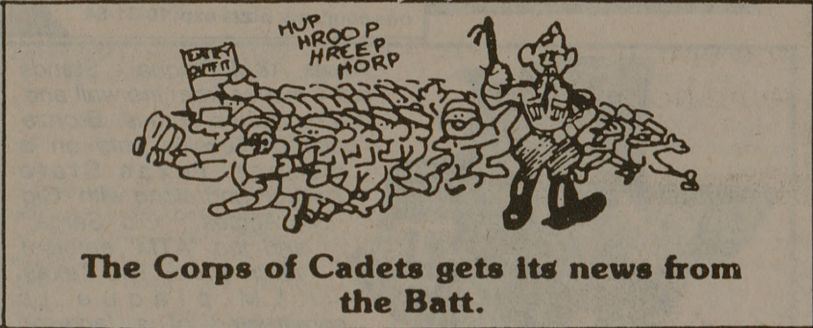
