Decision reversed new trial in order

AUSTIN — The Court of Criminal Appeals Wednesday reversed the murder conviction of a Corpus Christi man described as "a cancer cell" by a prosecutor.

The state's highest criminal appeal court ordered a new trial for William Edward Cortez, who was convicted of the 1975 shooting death of Gary Whitley.

Whitley was shot three times while trying to stop a restaurant robbery in Corpus Christi.

The new trial will be the third for Cortez, whose first conviction for capital murder was overturned on grounds his previous convictions were improperly allowed into the record.

In his second trial, Cortez was sentenced to life in prison for the slaying of Whitley.

The Court of Criminal Appeals ruled Cortez was entitled to a third trial because the prosecutor made improper arguments to the jury.

"You have a chance right now to cut this cancer cell out of this society and hopefully save it (society)," former Nueces County District Attorney William Mobley told the jury. "It is up to you 12 people. Now, the only punishment you can assess that would be any satisfaction at all to the people of this county would be life (imprisonment)."

The court ruled Mobley's arguments were improper and prejudicial.

"Jury argument by a prosecuting attorney that is designed to induce the jury to convict the defendant or

assess him a particular punishment because 'the people' desire such improper jury argument," the court said.

The court Wednesday also reversed the murder conviction of Jesse Joe Koehler and ordered a new trial. Koehler was sentenced to life in prison for the 1978 slaying of Landa G. Fuentes in San Antonio.

The court ruled defense attorneys should have been permitted to show that a key witness against Koehler harbored malice against him.

The court returned to a lower appeal court for further consideration of the case of Dan Lee Ingham, who was convicted of killing his wife's alleged lover in 1980.

The Corpus Christi appeals court ruled Ingham was denied effective counsel and reversed his life prison sentence for the shotgun killing of Brett Michael Butler and his stabbing death of his wife.

But the Court of Criminal Appeals ruled the reversals were warranted because the errors by Ingham's attorneys would have affected the outcome of trial. The court also ruled that Ingham had effective counsel.

"The constitutional right to counsel does not mean errorless counsel whose competency or accuracy of representation is to be judged hindsight," the court said.

"The fact that appellant's counsel made mistakes at trial, and that counsel might have tried the case differently, does not show ineffective representation."

Ford, Carter head group

DALLAS — Former Presidents Gerald Ford and Jimmy Carter will lead an organization to promote world peace in the name of former Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, the slain leader's wife said Wednesday.

Jahan Sadat said Carter and Ford will be joined by former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, motivational expert W. Clement Stone and Dallas businessman Robert H. Dedman as directors of the Sadat Peace Foundation.

Sadat and foundation president James George, a retired Canadian ambassador, were in Dallas to discuss the possibility of a relationship between the foundation and Southern Methodist University.

Sadat indicated the foundation will focus on educational institutions as a way to foster a better understanding of problems, particularly in the Middle East.

The foundation's task is durable and lasting peace, she said. Her husband believed in peace in its most simple form, she said, the ability to think and plan for ways to

guarantee a secure and happy life for people of the world.

"I say the people of the world cause peace is indivisible," she said. "The peace you enjoy in the United States cannot be enjoyed unless there is peace in Lebanon, Iran, Iraq, in Afghanistan and other areas suffering from scourges of war."

Many areas of the Third World need help in finding peaceful solutions to problems, Sadat said. The foundation's first efforts will concentrate on Egypt and Israel.

"Since they started the peace must begin with these two, and it will spread to others," she said. Sadat said she hoped other countries will follow Egypt's working for peace in the Middle East.

"Egypt set the example by President Sadat's historic visit to Jerusalem," she said. "Now we see the Hussein again has relations with Egypt, and our president visited Jordan recently. That means what Sadat started was the thing to do."
