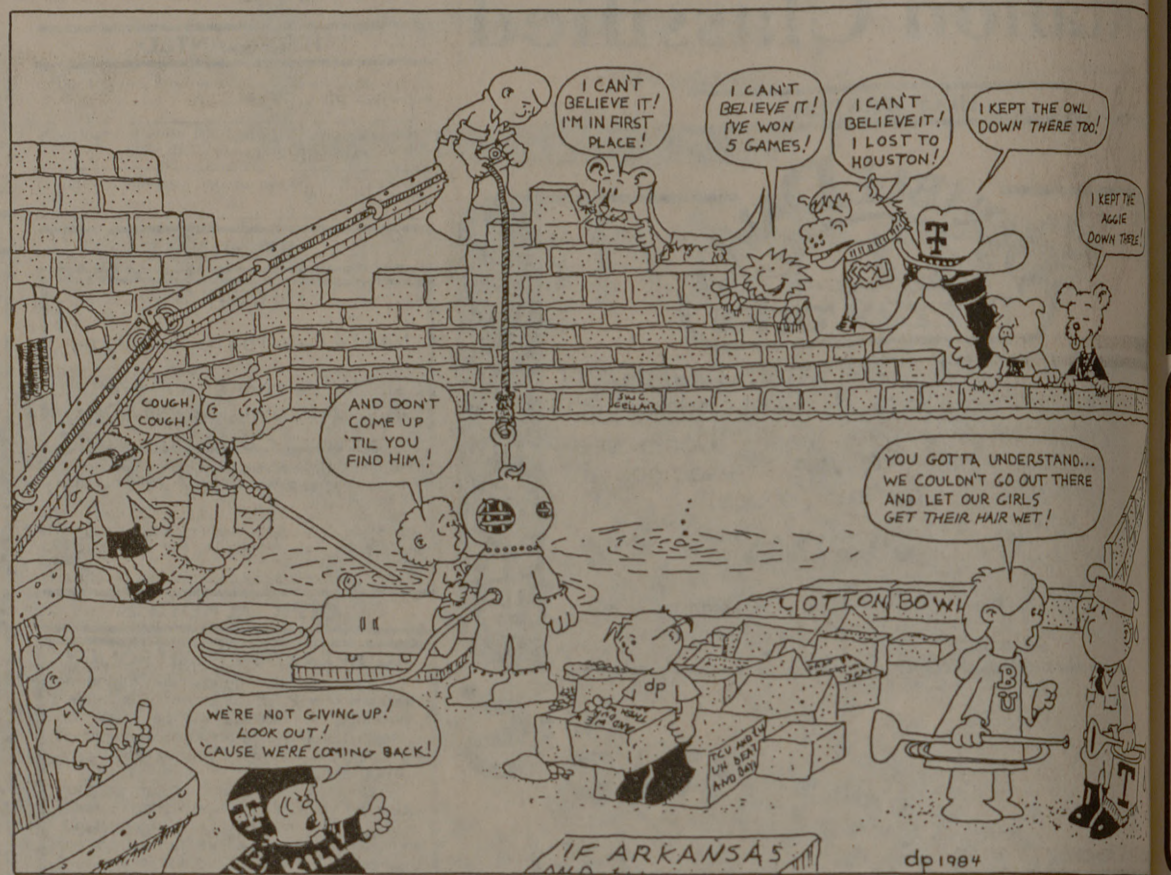

## 49ers struggle in victory over tough Oiler squad

HOUSTON — Joe Montana threw for 353 yards and three touchdowns to lead the San Francisco 49ers to a hard-fought 34-21 victory over the winless Houston Oilers Sunday afternoon.

The 49ers improved their record to 7-1 in the western division of the National Football Conference and ensured at least a two-game lead over the idle Los Angeles Rams.

The Oilers, 0-8, remain one of two teams in the NFL which were still winless. Buffalo is the other team.

The 49ers took the opening kick-off and drove 83 yards in ten plays to take a 7-0 lead. Montana passed for 52 yards in the drive including an 11-yard strike to tight-end Russ Francis for a touchdown.

Running back Wendell Tyler ran three times for 27 yards on the drive. The Oilers failed to move the ball, and the 49ers drove 44 yards and settled for a 26-yard Ray Wersching field goal and a 10-0 lead.

During San Francisco's next possession, Oiler cornerback Steve Brown intercepted a Montana pass at the Houston 35 and returned 26 yards to the 49er 38. After a 24-yard pass from Warren Moon to Tim Moriarity, Moriarity scored on a 1-yard run early in the second quarter to cut the lead to 10-7.

The Oilers were driving for the go-ahead touchdown when Moon was intercepted by cornerback Dana McLemore at the San Francisco 3-yard line. The 49ers sustained an 18-play 97-yard drive for a touchdown and a 17-7 halftime lead.

On the second play from scrimmage in the third quarter, San Francisco defensive end Lawrence Pillers recovered a Moriarity fumble at the Oiler 9-yard line. A 3-yard run down lunge by Tyler was nullified by a holding penalty. The 49ers set for a 22-yard field goal and a 17-7 lead.

After Moon was intercepted at the 49er 5-yard line, San Francisco moved to their own 24 and kicked a punt.

The Oilers drove from their own 37 to score in six plays and cut the lead 20-14. On a 45-yard touchdown pass from Moon to Tim Smith, the drive was aided by a third-down interference call against 49er safety (and former Aggie) Jeff Fuller.

When the 49ers again failed to move the ball, the Oilers drove yards to the San Francisco 16-yard line. A holding call nullified a completion which would have put the Oilers a first and goal situation and Florian Kempl missed a 35-yard field goal.
