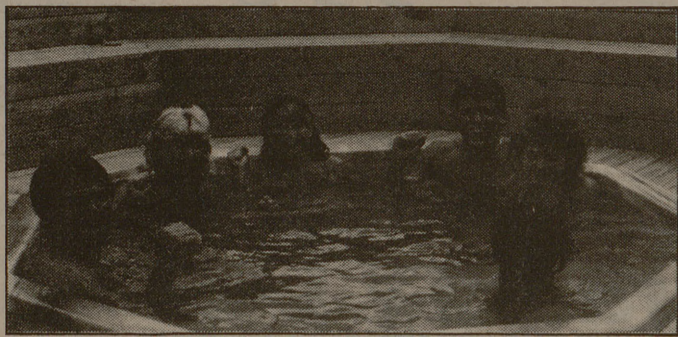

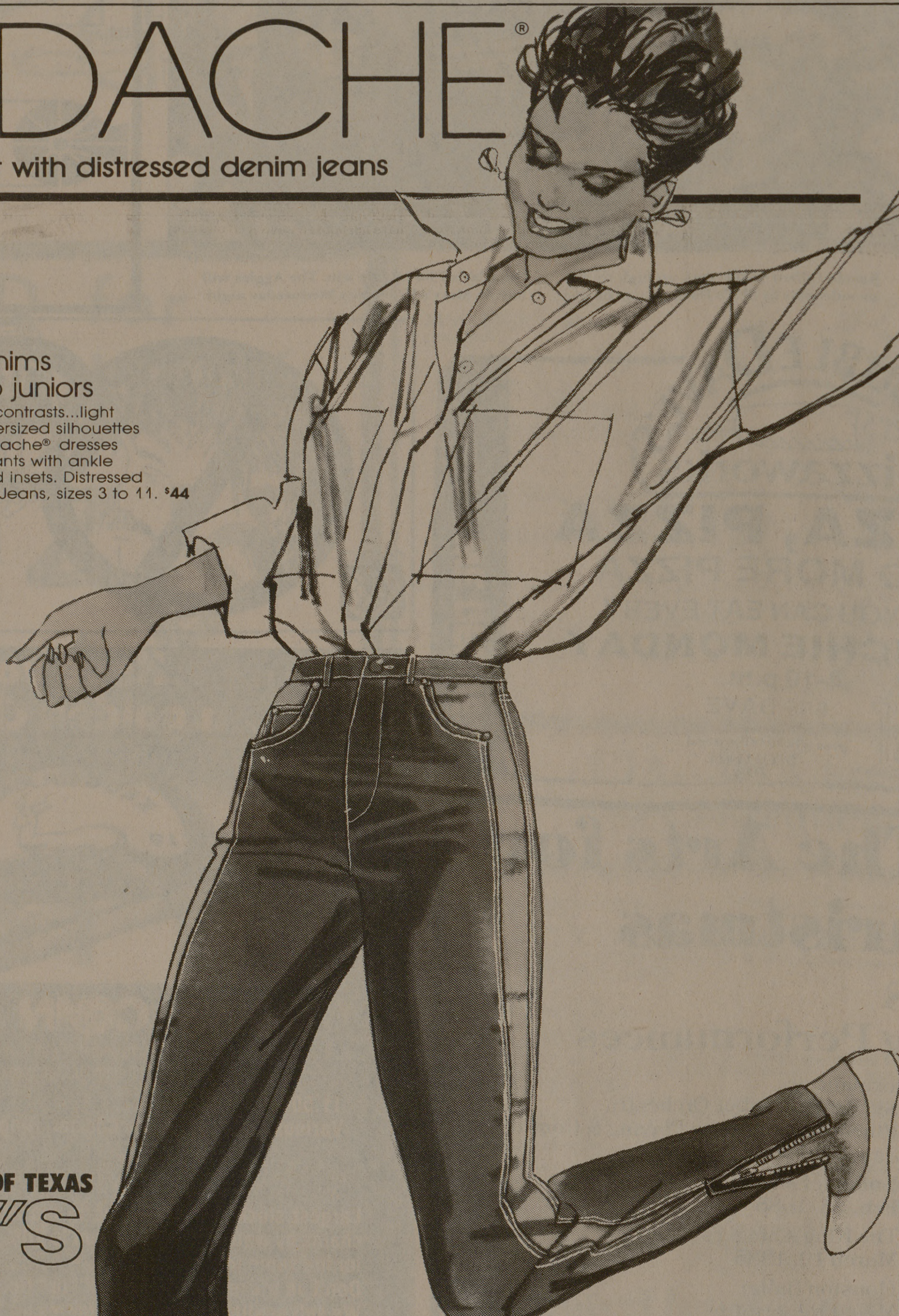

Houston's winning streak ends

Browns make Oilers blue

CLEVELAND — Larry Moriarty was lucky. After the Houston running back ran into the Cleveland defense and had to be carried off on a stretcher, subsequent X-rays proved negative.

Unfortunately, everything else the Oilers did Sunday also proved negative and X-rays were not needed to evaluate the damage.

"When it happened, I felt like I was dying," Moriarty said. "Even though I'm think I'm OK, thank God, I still feel lousy inside. The numbing sensation from the pinched nerve is going away, but not the emptiness. The Browns just dominated — period."

Paul McDonald threw three touchdowns passes, two of them to rookie wide receiver Brian Brennan and the Cleveland defense stifled the Houston offense in pacing the Browns to a 27-10 victory over the Oilers at Cleveland Stadium.

The decision raised the Browns' record to 4-9 overall and 3-2 under interim Head Coach Marty Schottenheimer. The 27 points were the most Cleveland's offense has scored this season.

"Cleveland is a very active team, using all their assets," said Oilers' coach Hugh Campbell. "They really beat on us. There was some hesitation on our part, and I think the Browns sensed that."

With the score tied 7-7 at the end of the first quarter, Matt Bahr broke the tie with a 18-yard field goal at 4:23 of the second quarter. Houston got the ball back, but not for long. Cleveland defensive end Keith Baldwin tipped a Warren Moon pass intended for Carl Roaches, and cornerback Hanford Dixon intercepted

at the Houston 45-yard line and returned it to the 36.

Six plays later, McDonald tossed a 12-yard pass to veteran tight end Ozzie Newsome, who danced around cornerback Willie Tullis and stumbled into the endzone at 8:32. Bahr added the conversion to make it 17-7.

Again, Houston gave the ball back on a Moon interception, his 10th of the season. Linebacker Tom Cousineau tipped a pass and safety Al Gross intercepted at his 37 and ran 47 yards to the Houston 16. Bahr then kicked a 28-yard field goal at 13:09 that gave Cleveland a 20-7 halftime advantage.

The third quarter was scoreless, although Houston linebacker Robert Brazile intercepted McDonald for the NFL-leading 18th time he has

been picked off this season. However, Houston's possession ended when Moon sacked for a 21-yard loss at midfield by end Reggie Carr. Houston's Joe Cooper brought the Oilers to within 20-10 on a 35-yard field goal 3:04 into the fourth quarter, but Cleveland stormed back. With 4:20 left in the game, Donald capped the scoring with a 17-yard TD strike to Brennan.

"Brian has a great pair of hands," said McDonald, who finished with 16-of-26 passing for 151 yards, two TD's and one interception. "I'm going to guys like him and Ozzie. It's real pleasure."

Green had 26 carries for 74 yards and Newsome caught 10 passes for 102 yards and a touchdown.

Moon was sacked four times, three by Camp — and could have managed 84 yards on 9-of-20 passes and two interceptions. James Williams led the dismal aerial attack with two catches for 22 yards.

"I really don't know why I got clicked," Moon said. "The Browns' defense put you under a lot of pressure, and I think they covered receivers very well. Obviously, they intercepted me twice."

Seahawk head — missing in action

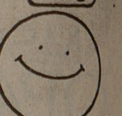
