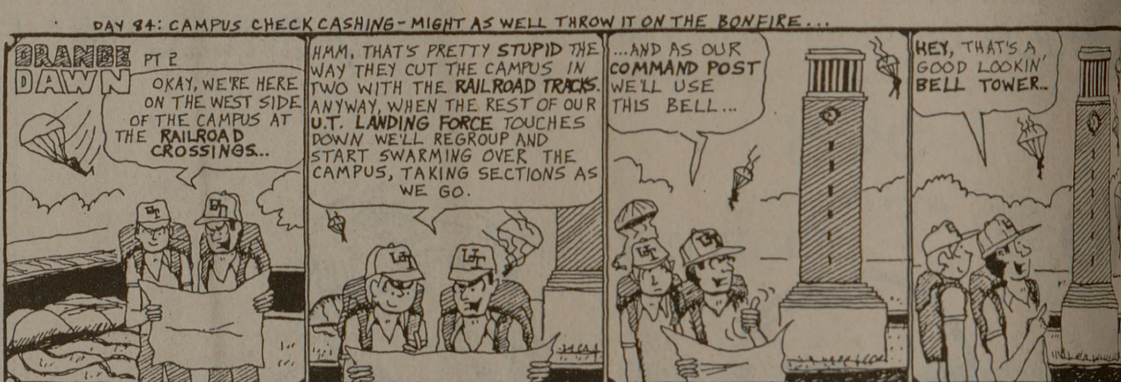

dollars so that if they get a gift, they can match it and create a chair. Why aren't we doing that?"

"Well, finally we are doing that." Shutes says change such as that is what the Target 2000 committee is hoping for. He says the committee has outlined this set of problems facing the University and other parts of the System in an attempt to make visions such as Vandiver's a possibility.

"The language of this report re-

inforces those ideas wherever it can," Shutes says. "We did not try to get to the question of organizationally how do you make a world university. We left that to Vandiver. We simply said that it is a good direction to go in."

Shutes says the basic problems must be addressed first, but that there has to be a dream.

"I look at that as a vision, a high-

powered vision," he says. "I think it has a lot of appeal."

"I hear faculty members from time to time saying, 'What the hell are we talking about a world university for when we can't even clean up our own back yard?' Well, unless someone is looking out there to what we can be, we don't want to clean up our back yard."

"They kind of go hand in hand. You've got to have some future thinkers and some present does."

## Officials still looking for La Tuna escapee

ANTHONY - Federal officials today were still searching for a prisoner who escaped from the La Tuna Federal Correctional Institution Saturday night.

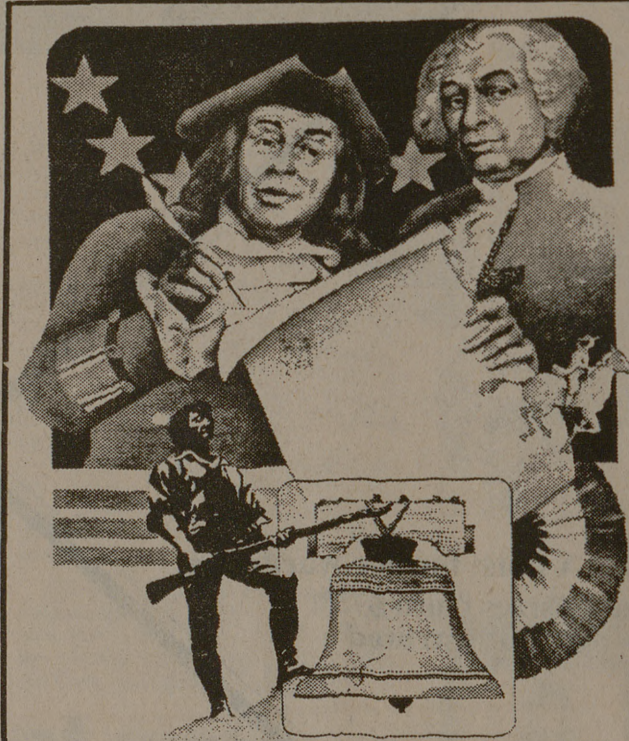
The inmate was identified as Antonio Gongales Espinosa, 26, a Colombian national. La Tuna officials say Gongales Espinosa is not considered dangerous.

Prison officials say Gongales Espinosa walked away from a minimum security camp outside the main prison, located near the Texas-New Mexico state line about 30 miles north of El Paso and 20 miles south of Las Cruces, N.M.

Gongales Espinosa was serving a 12-year sentence for possession with intent to distribute cocaine.

William Messersmith, executive assistant to the warden, said the inmate was discovered missing during the 9:30 p.m. bedcheck. He said there are six body counts a day.

Messersmith said the prisoner may have escaped into Mexico. Gongales Espinosa was arrested in New Mexico and began serving his sentence in July, 1983.
