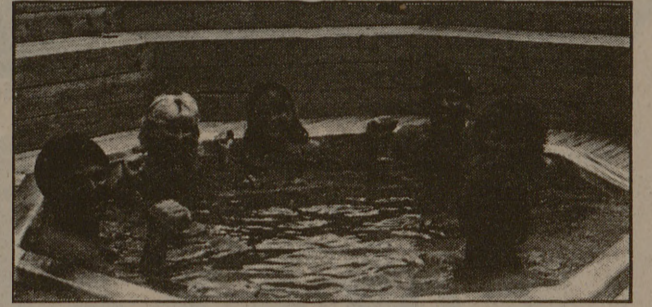
Oilers 23, Steelers 20
