

Tatum tears ligaments as Langston leads Ags

On a night in which the Texas A&M women's basketball team frequently misfired, Lisa Langston really hit the spot. She also hit 11 of 20 field goals and nine of 10 free throws to spearhead the Aggies' 77-66 win over Stephen F. Austin in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

A&M outshot SFA 42.3 percent to 41.8 percent from the field and took 19 more free throws than the Ladyjacks. However, the Aggies were outrebounded 49-35 and were generally banged, battered and bruised under the basket.

"I was not pleased," A&M Coach Lynn Hickey said. "I was pleased with the win, but I wasn't pleased with how we played. We lacked in-

'We are 4-1 on the season, though, and we're taking them one game at a time. Every win is impor-

However, while the win was not particularly impressive, it was quite expensive. Junior center Michell Tatum re-injured ligaments in her left knee after returning for the first time in two weeks.

Hickey said the second injury is more severe than the first and might sideline Tatum for the rest of the

Even with Tatum's six-foot, threeinch body doing battle in the middle of the lane, the Ladyjacks pumped the ball inside from the outset of the game, mostly to freshman Antoinette Norris.

Norris, a six-foot center with approximately the same width as a Redskins' offensive lineman, had 15 first half points to go with 10 re-bounds. At the half, the SFA team as a whole had as many offensive re-bounds as the Aggies had total re-


A&M regrouped around the eight early points of senior forward Jenni Edgar and took took a 39-35 half-time lead, despite a seeming lack of intensity and a futile zone defense.

"She (Coach Hickey) really let us have it at halftime," senior Mary Ann Swearngin said. "We knew we had to be more intense in the second

The Aggies opened the half in a man-to-man defense, full courtpressed at every opportunity, and seemed determined to out-quick the inexperienced Ladyjacks.

Using sophomore Rochelle Bennett off the bench, A&M cut off the passing lanes and began making their own scoring opportunities after steals.

Langston willingly became the baker and roasted the Ladyjacks' turnovers, scoring 16 second half points on an assortment of twisting

A 10-foot jumper by Langston with three seconds left on the shot clock and a following rim-rattling lay-up by Holly Hodges were the final nails in the SFA coffin. Three minutes of garbage-time later, the Aggies were victorious; they were also asking questions about the fu-


"The quick line-up and the aggressive defense are what we have to do to be successful this year," Hickey said. "Lisa had a good game for us,
