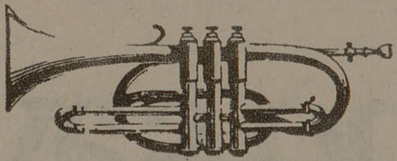

# Fingerprints don't match in Fort Worth investigation

FORT WORTH — The single piece of evidence linking a 25-year-old man with the murder of a 20-year-old woman was discredited Tuesday by the Fort Worth Police Identification Bureau, officials said.

Tarrant County Sheriff's officials had believed that a fingerprint found on the trunk of the woman's car matched one of Timothy Paul Volkmar, so he was charged Sunday in the shooting death of Lisa Griffin.

But Fort Worth police experts said Tuesday that the two prints do not match, Assistant District Attorney Steve Chaney said, adding that Tarrant County Sheriff's officials later concurred.

Chaney said Volkmar may be released Wednesday when the case against him is expected to be presented to a grand jury.

Griffin's body, with a single gunshot wound in the head, was found in southwest Tarrant County on Jan. 10. She is one of five women from southwest Fort Worth who are either missing or dead, and police have said the cases may be related.

"What I thought was the best piece of evidence we had turned out

not to be so good," Chaney said. "That case was filed on the minimum evidence needed. If he was the one, no one wanted to be responsible for him going out and killing again."

Chaney said the district attorney's office could dismiss the charge but that it is better, procedurally, to take the case to the grand jury once a charge is filed.

Meanwhile, Volkmar was held in the county jail in lieu of \$100,000 bond and for violating the terms of a previous probationary sentence, officials said.

# Woman sentenced for abuse

HOUSTON — A woman who failed through "ignorance" to feed her 4-month-old daughter as much as the infant needed to stay alive has been sentenced to 10 months probation on a charge of involuntary manslaughter.

The woman, Charlene Mae Spennemore Martinez, 28, pleaded a contest to the felony manslaughter charge and was sentenced on Monday by State District Judge I.D. Master.

Assistant District Attorney Brad Beers said the child, who weighed less at death than she did at birth, was fed primarily sugared water and did not receive enough nourishment to sustain her life.

However, Beers said that there was no malicious intent on the part of the mother.

"There was nothing to indicate that she tried to kill her baby or didn't want her baby," said Beers. "It's a pathetic situation."

Martinez' attorney, Ray Montgomery, said the woman didn't know enough about child care to feed the infant properly.

"I think this is nothing more than a case of ignorance," Montgomery said.

He said that he persuaded his client to plead no contest because he feared that her case would anger a trial jury and she would be found guilty.

Beers, on the other hand, said he was afraid a jury would take pity on the woman and acquit her of the crime.

Martinez' pleading and her sentence came as the result of a plea bargain.

The dead child, Rosa Linda Spennemore, was born in October, 1982, and died in January, 1983.

An autopsy showed she had no food in her stomach at death, and medical examiner ruled starvation the cause of death.

At the time the child was born, Martinez had four other children, none of whom were malnourished.

Parental rights to these children were severed, and they were taken into custody of the child welfare department.

Montgomery said Martinez gave birth to still another child while in jail and has retained custody of the child.

Martinez' husband, Benito Huerpa Martinez, a 38-year-old laborer who routinely works 12-hour days, did not know the child was being undernourished, attorneys said.

Mr. Martinez initially was charged in the death, but the state later dismissed its case against him.
