Port released from jail after 41/2 month stay

HOUSTON - Odétte Port was after answering questions before the released from jail Wednesday, still convinced she was right to follow her

She spent 4½ months in jail for refusing to testify before a grand jury investigating a murder charge when they decided not to testify the praised his wife's fortitude. against her son,

"I went to jail to do what I expected of myself as a wife and mother," Port said as she emerged from the Harris County Jail carrying bags of letters received during her

State District Judge I.D. McMaster issued the order releasing Port one day before the grand jury ses-

"I believe the family unit must be protected," Port said in a shaky voice. "I was faced with a choice, a choice between the law of the land and the law of my conscience. It was a very difficult choice and I paid the


Port and her husband, Bernard, were jailed Sept. 12 after repeatedly refusing to testify before a grand jury investigating the slaying of a female postal carrier. Mr. Port spent two months in jail but was released

He said Wednesday he and his wife never expected to be locked up when they decided not to testify. But

"She's staying in there for the love of a husband," Port said. " All I can find is beauty that there is someone who's done something for me. My concern is my wife and the sacrifice she made for me. She was the hero. I was the father."

The Port's son, David, 17, was indicted last September for the murder of letter carrier Debora Sue Schatz. The youth, who remains free on \$20,000 bond, will be tried next month in New Braunfels, a community 175 miles northwest of Hous-

Although a murder indictment was returned by the grand jury, prosecutors asked the panel to continue its investigation into Schatz's death for evidence that could warrant upgrading charges to capital
