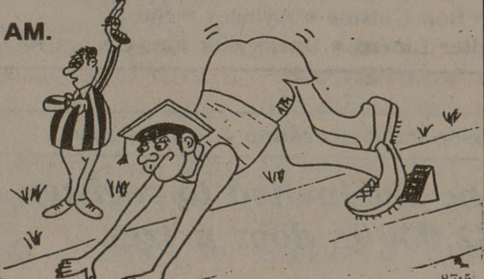

MSC sponsors All Night Fair this Saturday

The Memorial Student Center will be converted to a County Fair Saturday for the MSC sponsored All Night Fair.

The "All Night County Fair" will last from 7 p.m. until 3 a.m. About 60 organizations will participate. Games sponsored by the groups include a cow chip throwing contest with real cow chips, mice races, kayak races, horseshoe throw and seed spitting.

Admission is \$1 per person at the door. Tickets to play games can be purchased for 10 cents each. Up to five tickets will be required to play each game.

Besides the games, a variety of other entertainment has been planned.

Two John Wayne movies—"True Grit" and "Stagecoach"—will be shown at 10:30 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. Cartoons will be shown at 8:30 p.m.

Also at 8:30 p.m., the Aggie All-manders will give a square dance demonstration in the MSC main lounge. Then at 9:15 p.m. a jalapeno eating contest is scheduled.

The Aggie Wranglers, a country-and-western dance group, will perform at 9:30 p.m., and from 10 p.m. until 2 a.m. The Debonaires will play country-and-western dance music.

During the Debonaires breaks, a Bevo calling contest and a best-fitting Wrangler jeans contest will be featured. A free pair of jeans will be given to the male or female with the most applause.

The All Night Fair also includes a barbeque cafe in 201 MSC, and a hayride is scheduled every 15 to 30 minutes at the Main Drill Field.

Mike Cramer, chairman for the All Night Fair committee, said the profits will go toward funding MSC committees.

Cramer said the participating organizations keep 90 per cent of what they make. The other 10 per cent goes to the ANF committee to pay for decorations, publicity, entertainment, and general expenses.

New bills would alter bingo laws

AUSTIN — Two bills introduced in the Senate on Wednesday could make state bingo laws more stringent and provide more money to charitable organizations, a lawmaker says.

One of the bills introduced by Sen. Carlos Truan, D-Corpus Christi, would amend existing bingo law to allow the state comptroller's office to check criminal records of those applying for a bingo operator's permit.

The second bill introduced by Truan would provide tougher criminal penalties for violations than under the existing bingo law.

The bill would raise the penalty for violating the bingo law from a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by up to \$200, to a class A misdemeanor with a maximum penalty of \$2,000. A second offense would be changed from a Class B misdemeanor to a third-degree felony.

Truan noted that recent studies of bingo in Texas have indicated that many bingo promoters are taking the bulk of the proceeds for themselves, when the law intended that as much money as possible go to sponsoring charities.
